### **Traffic Forum Yeilds Concrete Results**

Alex Wan, District 6 City Council representative and Kirk Rich, MLPA Traffic Chair held a Traffic Forum in March that has already resulted in some significant improvements. At the May MLPA meeting, Councilman Wan reported that the City Council has approved three of the requests from the forum:

1. There will be a protected left turn lane from Piedmont onto Piedmont Circle.

2. A four way stop will be placed at the intersection of Amsterdam and Lanier.

3. The 25 mph speed limit will be extended to include North Morningside Road between North Highland and Lanier (currently the speed limit is 30 mph on this stretch of road).

This is a big win. The board expressed thanks to Alex for his efforts. Note that once approved, it will take several months for the signage to be installed/changes to be made.

Kirk Rick also reports that the Traffic Committee continues to work with Wan's office on issues identified in the Traffic Forum. They are continuing to work with Mill Creek on the new development at Piedmont & Cheshire Bridge and will be notifying neighbors about upcoming meetings on the Monroe Drive Smart Street Initiative. ### **Charter District, E-Splost Plans and Education**

Beginning July 1, Atlanta Public Schools (APS) will join Fulton County, Decatur, and Marietta school districts as a Charter School District. Under the contract, in exchange for commitments to meet certain objectives, the district gains more local control and receives waivers on some mandates. <u>Read more</u>.

The Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (E-SPLOST) that voters approved in the May election sends about \$464 million to the APS over the life of the penny-tax. APS Superintendent Meria Carstarphan told the <u>AJC</u> in May that she advocates the expansion of Grady High School's campus, conversion of Howard High School into a middle school, conversion of Inman Middle School to an elementary

school, the renovation of Morningside Elementary and the construction of new sports practice fields on the former Walden Middle School campus.

The MLPA Education Committee reminds parents about a couple of things they should do during the lazy days of summer:

1. Update your family's contact information in school directories this summer in order to be included in upcoming 2016-2017 print editions

2. The APS school year begins Wednesday, August 3. For a limited time, APS registration (<u>Download</u> <u>Available Here</u>) is conveniently being held at Morningside, Inman and Grady, respectively, for incoming kindergarteners and all other students new to the school.

### MLPA Neighborhood Watch Program Recognized by APD

The application sought to ensure that the MLPA program maintains a safe community, communicates effectively within the neighborhood, promotes activities that build community, and maintains connections with outside resources, such as state and local representatives.

Major Van Hobbs, Commander, and Lajuana Solomon, Crime Prevention Inspector from Zone 2, Atlanta Police Department, attended the June MLPA board meeting to congratulate the neighborhood and administer the Neighborhood Watch Program pledge to our block captains and board members (download below).



Participation in the city-wide program strengthens the neighborhood's relationship with the Atlanta police and city representatives and affirms our commitment to crime prevention in the community. The MLPA will work with Inspector Solomon regarding the placement of Neighborhood Watch signs around the area.
