Summer Security Reminders

Recent incidents in the Ansley Park neighborhood serve as reminders to be watchful during the summer months and especially when you are away on vacation. In that neighborhood, thieves walked up driveways to see if computers or other valuables were near windows, and then broke into the houses through a nearby door or window. It takes only a few minutes for them to steal the items and get to their waiting car. Since this has happened nearby, it may also happen in our neighborhood.

At night and when you are away from the house, please lock all doors and windows and turn on your alarm system.

If you go away on vacation, please take the following precautions:

- · Let your neighbors know that you will be away.
- Stop your paper and mail or ask a neighbor to collect them. Newspapers in the driveway and mail stuffed in the mailbox are signs that no one is home.
- Let neighbors know if you are expecting any packages to be delivered and ask if they could retrieve them from your porch.
- Ask neighbors to remove flyers that are hung on the front door or mailbox.
- · Lock all doors, windows, garages, and sheds when you leave.
- Don't post on Facebook that you are not home and how long you will be gone.
- Use timers to turn on lights and a radio or television while you are traveling.
- · Leave spare keys with neighbors; do not "hide" them outside.
- Keep your shrubbery trimmed to make sure that burglars cannot check out your property without being seen

The MLPA Security Patrol will conduct a vacation check of your house while you are away. They log their visits to your house and any actions that they take while there, like removing a newspaper from the driveway. On one occasion, when my family returned home from vacation one day early, the MLPA Security Patrol officer knocked on the door and asked to see an ID.

Keep your cars cleaned out. Car break-ins are the most frequently occurring crime in our neighborhood. These are crimes of opportunity. Keep your cars locked and cleaned out. Please tell your visitors and house-guests to do the same.

Smith Park Fountain Idled by Drought Level 2 Declaration

The reason is that the Georgia EPD has issued a Level 2 Drought for the Atlanta metro area. Under this designation, ornamental water features like fountains must be turned off to preserve water

We are hopeful that the recent rainy spell has begun filling Lake Lanier sufficiently that the drought level can soon be relaxed. Rest assured that once it is, the fountain will flow once again. In the meantime, let its lack of bubbles serve as a reminder to conserve water for us all.

Summer brings a variety of free cultural events to Piedmont Park-this month the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra's free concerts return to Oak Hill (Piedmont Park along 10th Street). After a huge response to the return of the ASO to this venue, they will be back again on Thursday, June 15 at 7:30 PM. Bring your blankets, food, drinks, friends, and family to enjoy an evening of selections ranging from David Bowie to Tchaikovsky led by Assistant Conductor, Joseph Young.

That same weekend, Loridans Foundations presents a Horizon Theater performance in the Promenade by the botanical garden. The show, *Nobody Loves Me*, is a musical spoof of reality TV shows. It runs Wednesday, June 14-Saturday June 17 with performances at 7:30 PM each night. Attendees may bring a picnic or purchase from onsite food trucks and concessions/bar. Audiences can bring

their own food, water, and soft drinks - but no alcohol or glass. Wine, beer, water and soft drinks will be available for purchase. Grounds open for picnicking at 6pm.

<u>Tickets</u> are free, but you must reserve them as seating is limited. You can also purchase table seating, reserved seats, or an entire table.

Registration for Atlanta Public Schools (APS) 2017-2018 Year

Those new to the neighborhood or with children transitioning to Kindergarten, Middle School or High School may need to register their students if they have not already done so. Our neighborhood school, Morningside Elementary, is a Grady Cluster school within the Atlanta Public School (APS) system and feeds into Inman Middle and Grady High.

APS encourages parents of new and transitioning students, or those families that have a new address, to visit the Department of Student Assignment & Records, 130 Trinity Ave, Atl. 30303, June 19-23 and June 26-29 from 830a-4p, to register students for the 2017/18 SY. 
As of the 2016-17 SY, students will only need to re-register if they are transitioning from the 5th to 6th grade, 8th

to 9th grade, or if they have moved.
