On Monday, October 8, the MLPA Board meeting was cancelled so that members could attend a public hearing on the Master Plan before the City Council's Community Development Human Resources Committee. The Board anticipates that the Master Plan will be formally adopted by City Council at the meeting scheduled for October 15.

Restoration in the Morningside Nature Preserve

Over the past 3 months, Trees Atlanta has worked with volunteers to remove invasive plants and vines from



the Morningside Nature Preserve. This green-space in our neighborhood is one of 5 parks where Trees Atlanta has been working on forest restoration. We removed an impressive mound of Chinese Privet and other invasive plants from the refuge in preparation for replanting with native species this fall.




Atlanta Police Department's NEW Online System for Reporting Some Types of Crime

The Atlanta Police Department has launched an online reporting system to allow city residents to submit reports about a variety of crimes. The public can submit reports at their convenience and without waiting for an officer to show up to take a report. The system is expected to free up officer resources and to encourage more complete reporting from the public. If you do not report, then the crime volume for our neighborhood will appear less serious than it really is.

Car break-ins are the biggest law enforcement problem in Morningside and can be reported in the new system. Other crimes that can also be reported include: harassing phone calls/texts/emails, damage to property, lost property, identity theft, theft less than \$10,000, burglary from a building or storage facility, damage to vehicles on private property- like a minor traffic accident in a shopping center parking lot, fraudulent use of a credit card, etc.

Preserving the Morningside Lenox Park Tree Canopy--Free Trees

Trees Atlanta's Neighborwoods free tree program is just the thing for homeowners wanting to plant a tree. In our neighborhood, each property is eligible for up to three trees to be planted in the front, back, side yard or the right-of-way. You select the trees you want, choose your spot (Trees Atlanta can offer advice), and then folks arrive with your trees and plant them - it's kind of like magic!

While the original program only offered trees for front yards, thanks to a new grant, Trees Atlanta is offering Morningside neighbors trees for any part of their yard. You may have some say about the kind of tree planted, but you will be limited to non-invasive species. The planting is estimated for January in Morningside (30 gallon trees, approx 12-15 feet tall). And if you don't have space for a large canopy tree or would like to increase the food production of your property, they also offer edibles including persimmon, pawpaw, serviceberry, and possibly apples, peaches and pears.

Folks say the best time to plant a tree is 20 years ago, but the second best time is now. I hope you'll join us in getting the next generation of Morningside's tree canopy rooted

MLPA Garden Club Tours Botanical Docent's Garden

Sally Crowe, MLPA Garden Club founding member, hosted us for a tour of her expansive garden on Courtenay. Because of the course of the creek running behind her property, Crowe has a deep back yard



that contains a number of treasures. When Crowe moved into her home, the backyard was covered in wisteria vines. Upon closer inspection, there she discovered the hard scape of an elaborate garden that she has spent several years restoring.



She concentrated the tour on the productive plants in her garden -- these are planted because they contribute

more than just beauty. She has an Edgeworthia or Paper Bush, a winter bloomer that is prized for the high quality paper that can be made from its bark. Next we viewed a buttercup witch hazel which natives used for potions to heal a variety of ills. Other productive plants she highlighted were buckeye, serviceberry, and beauty berry.

After the tour we enjoyed refreshments and a short business meeting--we will work on our adopted garden at the Lanier/Amsterdam monument on Sunday, October 21 at 1:30 PM.



Solarize Atlanta Deadline for Homeowners is Halloween

Homeowners and businesses in Atlanta have until Oct. 31 to sign up for the program to access free rooftop evaluations. Almost 1,000 have already signed up for the free evaluations, the first step in going solar.

Once property owners sign up, residential applicants have until Dec. 31 to sign contracts while the deadline for commercial customers has been extended to April 2019. The program hopes to encourage businesses and residential customers in the state to consider the benefits of installing solar panels on their rooftops.

"I think the program is accomplishing what we wanted. It's giving the people of Atlanta a chance to kick the tires of solar, become more comfortable with the idea and then take the step to actually put it in their own roof," said Jeanette Gayer, director at Environment Georgia, one of the organizations supporting the program.

The program works this way; the more people who sign up for the program within a community, the lower the cost of installation. The sponsor organizations have done research on all the different materials that are in to a program, making it more affordable with negotiated the bulk pricing. Old Fourth Ward residents Ruth and Larry Menter were the first beneficiaries to the program in the city of Atlanta. They completed installing solar panels and a battery for their home several months ago.

After an investment of about \$20,000, the couple anticipates cutting their energy costs by half in coming months. Menter commented, "The renewable energy side of it and reducing carbon emissions was probably the number one reason we were looking to do it."

The City of Atlanta's office of Resilience supports Solarize Atlanta efforts in encouraging the market for rooftop solar panels. "Programs like Solarize Atlanta are critical to reaching our clean energy goals," said Amol Naik, the city's chief resilience officer.

Solar contributes 6% of the city's energy needs.


