Note from MLPA President, Ben Nemo

Happy Spring! I wanted to share my monthly Top 3 with the neighborhood:

- 1) Q1 Progress. We are making progress against our stated objectives in the first three months of the year. Funding has increased thanks to new members (membership funding is 9% ahead of budget, having added 17 new members alone in March) and production contributions (\$5500 YTD!), reported car break-ins are down (by 3, or 9%) and we have funded additional License Plate Reader cameras to further curb, our Master Plan committee has been formed and is meeting monthly to determine the first initiatives to prioritize, and we now have friends' groups established for all our recreational parks among the 160 volunteers involved in our green spaces.
- 2) 2019 Budget. In our Q2 executive session we put together our budget for the year to allow for some additional recurring and one-time expenses. We will finalize in our May meeting and publish details on our website, but while protecting our reserves we are excited at the prospect of supporting new measures against our objectives.
- 3) Shout Outs. I want to keep highlighting the volunteers that make all of this work happen. Beyond the new names added to the LPR contributor list in this month's security report (we are only \$2,000 shy of our goal...wink wink), I want to say a huge thank you to Marla Johnson, Bryce Harvey, John Limestone and Jill Wolfe (in addition to our own Micah Coleman) who have all stepped up to form the friends' group for Sunken Garden Park. We can't do these things without the time and elbow grease of neighbors like these. If you also know them, please thank them!

In our April board meeting we also agreed that we would organize future monthly meetings to focus on specific topics – e.g. parks or security - and will advise of topics in hopes those of you with specific interests or ideas will join us for the matters that motivate you most. One great idea in the last meeting from a neighbor who had previous association experience in Sherwood Forest: host some of them in places where we can serve alcohol and mingle. Twist my arm!

That's all for now. Hope to see you this Friday at the concert!

Dust Off (or Order) Those Mosquito Traps

Spring is the perfect time to get out your mosquito traps and clean them up to get ready for the season. This is also the perfect time to do an audit of your yard and scope out any places where water may accumulate, making a breeding haven for mosquitoes. You can either devise a method to drain these areas or plan to use a larvaecide to minimize summer populations.

Trapping and destroying mosquitoes is the preferred method of control to minimize the impact on other wildlife. If you've noticed a decline in our bee and firefly population, it is directly related to the use of pesticides (including "natural" mosquito sprays which kill almost all flying insects), light pollution, and habitat destruction. Mosquito traps are a much more pollinator friendly approach to mosquito control. If you don't already have traps or need supplies, contact Wesley Aycock with Green Environmental, Inc.

Help Reduce Car Break-ins in Morningside

Car break-ins are the biggest crime problem we have in Morningside. These incidents occur far too frequently and are incredibly frustrating to all. As such, the MLPA Security Committee has initiated several activities to try to reduce the occurrence of these crimes this year. One step is to assess lighting in the neighborhood. For example, we are working to get additional lighting in Morningside Village. We need to hear from you about other areas where more lighting is needed. Another step is a renewed Clean Car Campaign. The Atlanta Police Department suggests never leaving valuables in your car in plain sight.

Clean Car Campaign Checklist

Place valuables in trunk BEFORE you arrive, not AFTER.

Every time you leave your car:

- Lock all windows and doors.
- Remove GPS and mounts.
- Remove cell phones, laptops, tablets.
- Remove ALL cords and power sources for electronic devices.
- Remove book bags, back packs, brief cases, shopping bags, and purses.
- Do not leave money, bills or coins, out in the open.
- Do not leave a firearm in your vehicle. In Atlanta, more than 900 guns were stolen from vehicles in 2018
- Tell your visitors to clean out their cars, even if they are just visiting for the evening.
- By doing this, you can prevent becoming a victim of our neighborhood's most common crime. Never keep a spare key inside the car.
