Another winter month ... another reason to endlessly talk about how wet the weather is. While we wait for spring I'd like to share some highlights from our February board meeting.

- 1. **Security Patrol.** Hopefully you read this in our security update, but earlier this month after an MLPA member realized his house had a late night prowler and called 911, our patrolman on duty, Officer Jemmy Haagsma, was the first to arrive on the scene and eventually located the perpetrator. This is a great example of how our patrol team can act fast to address a situation.
- 2. **Zoning 101.** The board spent a fair amount of time re-educating ourselves on key City and Master Plan land use standards to ensure we are reviewing variance cases objectively. We have had many cases of late without proper blueprints or hardship proof we will soon be stating very clear expectations for what to bring to the MLPA as far as variance approvals, but in the meantime if you are working on your home we ask that you ensure that your builder understands what we and the NPU need to review to make the process easy and straightforward. (Side note: we also hear from the city that Morningside is the neighborhood that most often violates construction without the appropriate permits. If you see a project in the neighborhood without a permit post or a tree coming down without the appropriate notice, please call 311.)
- 3. Save the Date! A neighborhood event is in the works for the evening of Saturday, November 7. More to come but expect a fun new way to interact with neighbors thanks to the thoughtful work of many of our new MLPA board members and other volunteers. (In fact, with so many new board members we are reviving our board profiles in this issue.)

MLPA Salutes Officer of the Month - Officer Jemmy Haagsma

Early one morning last week, Officer Jemmy Haagsma, Atlanta Police Department, was working a second job with the Morningside Security Patrol, when he took a call from a resident on N Morningside. At about 2:00 am, a Ring floodlight camera set off the motion detector at the resident's house. The resident then checked the footage that showed a suspicious person dressed in all black walking down his driveway and entering a neighbor's driveway. He called the police and, while still on the phone with the police, saw the suspicious person return to his driveway. The suspect hurried off when the neighbor's floodlight lit up again. The police arrived promptly, and the first responding officer was Jemmy Haagsma with the Morningside Security Patrol. Officer Haagsma and another officer on duty for the City canvassed the area, and located the suspected prowler coming out of a property near the intersection of N Morningside and N Highland. The neighbor confirmed the identity of the suspect, who was arrested and will likely be charged with prowling. Morningside extends a heartfelt thank you to Officer Haagsma with Morningside Security Patrol and to the Atlanta Police Department for the quick response. The neighborhood is recognizing Officer Haagsma as our Officer of the Month, a new program designed to honor the officers who work to keep our neighborhood safe. Please look for our new Officer of the Month signs.

Officer Haagsma grew up in Jakarta Indonesia. His grandmother was Dutch, hence his last name. He came to New York in 1999, where he was a handyman for 15 years, and a policeman for several of those years. He has been with the Atlanta Police Department since 2017. When his first marriage was over, he pursued a childhood dream of becoming a cop. "I was really happy when the Atlanta Police Department called me. I am honored to do this job and will continue to give my best." He lives in Lilburn with his wife and son, and they are expecting a daughter this month. He has two children from his first marriage and enjoys being his own mechanic in his spare time. He owns several cars and motorcycles and can frequently be found in his garage doing repairs and maintenance.

Officer Haagsma was able to respond quickly because of procedures that the Morningside Security Patrol follows. When the MLPA Patrol Officer comes on duty each day, this is a second job for him. He carries his City of Atlanta radio and checks in with the City dispatcher to report what hours he is on duty for Morningside. That way, he shows up on the dispatcher's screen as available in our neighborhood. He cannot take certain types of calls, such as accidents or any other calls that require a City of Atlanta vehicle with blue lights. MLPA Patrol officers can get dispatched to an incident in several ways. In this case, the dispatcher knew Officer Haagsma was in the area and available. Another officer on duty in the area could also get the call. The MLPA Patrol officers frequently step forward to assist the City policemen who are patrolling in the neighborhood.

The Morningside Security Patrol is 100% funded by MLPA memberships. More memberships mean more patrol coverage. If you would like to join, please go to https://www.mlpa.org/mlpa-memberships/. This incident provides a good example of how the Ring camera and the quick responses of the Morningside Patrol and the City of Atlanta worked together to capture this suspect. As always – neighbors need to call 911 when they see something suspicious!!

Sunken Garden Receives Park Pride Grant

An obvious first battle for the new Friends of Sunken Garden is drainage. The group has announced that they've received a Park Pride Community Building Grant (supported by The Home Depot Foundation) in the amount of \$10,000.

Currently, Sunken Garden Park is unusable after each heavy rain. With this grant, new drainage lines will be installed to help eliminate the resulting flooding, pooling and mud. Additionally, a granite seat wall will not only act as a barrier between the play area and a slope plagued by water runoff and soil erosion, it will also provide a natural, integrated play element for children and additional seating for all.

"We are on a mission to help neighbors rediscover, restore and reclaim this 'sunken' treasure," said Marla Johnson, a founding member of the Friends of Sunken Garden Park group. The Community Building Grant from Park Pride will enable necessary improvements so the park can once again become a space that engages residents, builds relationships and creates memories.

What is "Grady Cares"? Grady Cares is a group of neighborhood volunteers who work with Grady High School's Principal, Counselors and Social Worker to help the nearly 300 homeless and impoverished students at the school get groceries, clothing and basic supplies.

Through a Facebook group of over 800 members, individual student's needs are anonymously described and those who are able and willing to help do so with the click of a button. Grady Cares also has an Amazon Wish List that includes items regularly needed by these students (toiletries, jackets, school supplies, etc.) Lastly, a team of volunteers is working to open a Grady Cares free thrift store inside the VH Church (across from Inman Middle School) to provide the school's neediest students with free shoes, clothes and coats. This is expected to open in April 2020 and updates will be provided about how to donate goods.

AJC Peachtree Road Race Gift to Morningside: Upcycled Benches

The 50th Running of the AJC Peachtree Road Race was a once-in-a-lifetime event, a milestone so significant that <u>Atlanta Track Club</u> upcycled the plastic water bottles they collected from the finish line into park benches for the Atlanta community.

With the Club hosting nearly 150,000 participants annually, 60,000 of them at the Peachtree, the largest 10K in the world and largest road race in the country, they realized the importance of taking steps to promote greater environmental responsibility within the city. Thus, the Green Initiative launched last spring, a multi-faceted plan to reduce and reuse waste and materials at Club events and programs. Since then, the Club has developed recycling plans for each of its events, but nothing compares with the massive scale of the Peachtree. With thousands of participants crossing the finish line, the Club knew they were up for a challenge. So, a list of goals was formed specifically surrounding sustainability for the 50th Running – one of which was to upcycle all the plastic water bottles into something meaningful for the community.

In the heat of a July 4 in Atlanta, everyone knows the importance of staying hydrated; a total of 1.01 tons of plastic water bottles were collected from the finish line at Peachtree this year, with a dedicated group of Green Team volunteers deployed to help participants place their bottles into the appropriate recycling container. Not everyone, however, knows what happened to them. Sit down: The plastic collected was upcycled into 64 park benches in two different styles, 32 of which will be donated to sponsors, community partners, parks and tracks throughout metro Atlanta to serve as a legacy of the race and a gift to the running and walking community. And soon enough Morningside Lenox Park Association will be home to one of these benches.

The remaining 32 benches will be offered as a gift to the first 32 people who make a \$1,500 donation to the Club. It's your chance to support the Club's mission, endorse its Green Initiative and own a piece of the 50th Running. Visit atlantatrackclub.org/give-back.
