# **Food Drive at Sidney Marcus Park**

Our Friends of Sidney Marcus Park (FoSMP) hope you had a safe and restful holiday season! This dedicated group of residents is not only working hard on major park improvements, they are also helping the larger community around Morningside. In just a few days, the group will host their third food drive to benefit our neighbors at Intown Collaborative Ministries (ICM). During the first two drives, the FoSMP collected and delivered over 2700 pounds of food and hygiene essentials to this organization that works to prevent and reverse homelessness in Intown Atlanta.



The FoSMP will be at Sidney Marcus Park (786 Cumberland Rd. NE 30306) this **Friday**, **January 15 from 9am to 11am** and **Saturday**, **January 16 from 9am to 11am**. There will be a drop-off table and a Friends table at the picnic area on Cumberland Rd. Following are examples of the most requested items: canned proteins, canned fruits and vegetables, pasta, peanut butter, cereals, personal hygiene products.

Sidney Marcus Park is a focal point for this important need during these stressful times, and the Friends of the Park group plans to continue their successful drives this month and quarterly in 2021. Let's keep it going and catch up on park activities and plans. We hope to see you at the park!

# **Atlanta Neighborhood Security Coalition and Homelessness**

As many in our neighborhood know, the problem of homelessness and urban camping has grown significantly during the pandemic, creating significant quality of life issues for both these individuals and our neighbors. MLPA has joined with other neighborhood associations to form the Atlanta Neighborhood Security Coalition (ANSC) with an aim of working with city and state authorities to address these issues.

While crime, the plight of the mentally ill and addicted, and community safety are among the issues these camps raise, three very significant challenges are the risk of fires set by urban campers during the cold winter days, the difficulty of finding appropriate shelter for these individuals, and the added struggle of convincing the long-term homeless to accept help.

In recent weeks, ANSC leaders have met via Zoom with the Georgia Department of Transportation, local Atlanta Police Department zone leadership, the leadership of Partners for Home (the City's public-private "continuum of care" housing initiative), and with Atlanta COO Jon Keen. While the coalition pushes for GDOT to work with city officials to address the urban camps under the interstates and near GDOT-controlled rights of way, we are also encouraging the city to expand northward from downtown its efforts to address homelessness.

Meetings with the commander of APD's Community-Oriented Policing Section (COPS) and Homeless Outreach Proactive Enforcement (HOPE) team have also been fruitful. We understand that in January and February, the city will be working specifically to address the urban camps in the area of Cheshire Bridge, Sidney Marcus Boulevard and Morosgo/Piedmont. In the past few days, crews have cleared out the camps at I-85 and Cheshire Bridge and have offered housing to a number of campers. Trash was removed from both sites, as well, and rip rap (rocks) will be installed under I-85.



Until the pandemic passes, however, it appears that completely clearing these urban camps will not occur. The CDC has recommended that the city not close camps during the pandemic, and the

AJC's J.D. Capelouto <u>reported in November</u> that the city has determined not to eliminate the camps until it can find housing for their residents.

Should you see a camp or individual who may benefit from public assistance or should you be concerned about camp-related trash or debris, please contact ATL311 and ask for outreach from one of the HOPE officers.

## **Holiday Gifts to Police and Fire Departments**

Every year around the holidays, MLPA thanks our police and fire departments for their service. Often partnering with nearby neighborhoods, including Virginia Highlands and Piedmont Heights, we recognize those working in APD's Zone 2 and Zone 6 and at Fire Station #19 on North Highland Ave. Last month, MLPA showed our appreciation in the following ways:

- A contribution towards gift cards for Zone 2 officers (who mainly handle incidents along Cheshire Bridge, north of Cheshire Bridge and Piedmont, and part of Piedmont Heights).
- The purchase of \$20 gift cards for all Zone 6 officers (who cover most of the incidents in the interior of our neighborhood).
- The purchase of \$20 gift cards for the men and women of Fire Station #19.



Because of your membership in MLPA, we are able to continually support these praiseworthy endeavors. Thank you for allowing us the opportunity to acknowledge and honor the efforts of those serving our neighborhood!

# **Meridian Chorale Surprises Neighbors with Holiday Concert**

# 2021 Parks Committee Update

Happy New Year from your Parks Committee. This pandemic has reinforced to us the critical importance of experiences in nature in our life. We've seen increased use of our parks and trails the past year and will leverage this in 2021. Our working philosophy is based on Transparency and Engagement.

In January we held our first 2021 MLPA Parks Committee meeting, an open forum for all neighbors with an interest in our parks and greenspaces. Held 7pm the first Thursday of each month, this is an opportunity to learn about other groups' efforts, share concerns, and help plan and enact our visions for these gems of our neighborhood. There were three clear takeaways from this meeting.

- Fundraising. We need a neighborhood-wide fundraising mechanism supporting all
  our parks in order to pool resources, maintain a coherent approach, and avoid donor
  fatigue. MLPA will take the lead and is calling for volunteers who want to help plan
  some fun events and work with motivated neighbors to support our community.
- **Erosion**. With climate change and continual upstream development, we have witnessed severe erosion along the banks of South Fork Peachtree Creek. We are forming a committee to identify potential solutions.
- Liaison. Friends of Park groups are composed of park guardians focusing their tireless efforts on their local parks. The Parks Chair will maintain the various relationships with City of Atlanta and non-profit groups to bring expertise, funding, and support to these groups.

We need you! We need your time, expertise, love, and money. With volunteer workdays, Covid-style virtual workdays, event planning, education and engagement, there is plenty of work to do, so please reach out. No experience required!

Invasive species including Chinese privet, Cherry Laurels, English ivy, and Japanese honey suckle were pulled out so that nutrients and light can reach these ephemerals.

Please wear a mask, bring your own gloves/tools, and plan to remain socially distant from all but your immediate pod. We'll work until about noon and will have forest stewards on hand to help show you how to identify and remove problem plants.

### **Building a Community: Sidney Marcus Park and Girl Scouts**

Friends of Sidney Marcus Park saw a real bright spot in 2020 with an outpouring of support for the park as they work toward a major renovation in 2021. The group received donations from over 170 donors totaling \$112,000. There are so many people and organizations to thank and highlight, but one stands out: Girl Scout Troop 17744.

This Morningside Elementary troop has been meeting in Sidney Marcus Park for the past 6 years on Sunday evenings (monthly) from kindergarten through 5th grade. They made terrific use of the

park: Girl Scouts honor and pledge, Red Cross emergency preparedness, my family story recipe swap, crafts, drawing, painting, singing, and lots of Juliette Gordon Low birthday parties.



Over the years, the troop has focused on the needs of the community by donating to various causes, such as CHOA and rescue dog organizations. In 2020, the girls decided to use their cookie sale earnings to improve their own home base by donating \$400 to the Friends of Sidney Marcus Park capital campaign.

"We were so happy to see the troop's support for our park, but more importantly, their use of the park and their relationship with the park and our neighborhood," said John Pappas from Friends of Sidney Marcus Park. "We continue to uncover the history of the park and its value to Morningside. Girl Scout Troop 17744 is a joyful example of the role of our parks and community groups."

The Girl Scout troop, led by Betty Treschitta and Yolanda Foreman, deserves special recognition for its hard work and philanthropy These girls are moving on to young adulthood, but their impact and use of Sidney Marcus Park will be lasting a lasting memory in the rich history of the park. 

# **Morningside Pride and History**

In 1990-91, the MLPA erected 12 monuments to mark the neighborhood's borders. Patterned after the original monuments fashioned by Smith and Rankin, they were updated using the only original Lenox Park marker - located at 878 Plymouth Rd. - as a model. Have you found all of these urn-capped pillars? The one in our MLPA logo does not count! ;)



Interested in learning more about our neighborhood while you are out and about? Check out the Morningside Walking Tour! Originally researched by MLPA stalwarts in the early 1990s for publication around the time of the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games, it is a six mile walk through history (but you don't have to do it all at once).
