President's Note

It's August...it's HOT...so why not dedicate that theme to Cheshire Bridge?

1. Here we go again. The fire last week that closed a section of Cheshire Bridge to through traffic will unfortunately have a lasting impact. Structural damage to the bridge (sound familiar?) means it must be demolished. The best estimate is it will take a year to repair. Detour signs currently reroute traffic in several directions but unfortunately that includes Morningside. If you see problems as a result, please let us know so we can ask for help in addressing them.

2. Windemere for the Win! Unfortunately that street damage has not disrupted the evening nightclub visitors and the general rise in post-pandemic activity continues to negatively impact nearby streets. One set of neighbors on Windemere worked with Council Member Ide's office to justify speed "tables" (aka bumps) to address the high levels of speeding that have been surging in recent months – and that legislation will be presented to City Council for hopeful approval on Monday.

3. Dancing on a grave. See anything missing in the picture above? That's right – Intown Suites was at least torn down this week after way far too many years of neglect from its former owner Paces Properties. I am so grateful to Council Member Ide and others who pushed for resolution as well as the new property owner Fairfield Residential who worked to accelerate demolition.

Since our July meeting update, the new volunteer "crime action teams" have been getting organized. We will keep you posted on their progress – but as evidenced by the Windemere example above, community elbow grease can go a long way if you see something you want for your street or Morningside in general.

Our Summer Movie Night series has been a success – please join our last one on Friday, August 27 and we look forward to additional opportunities to get together appropriately in the coming months. As always – stay safe!

Summer Movie Series

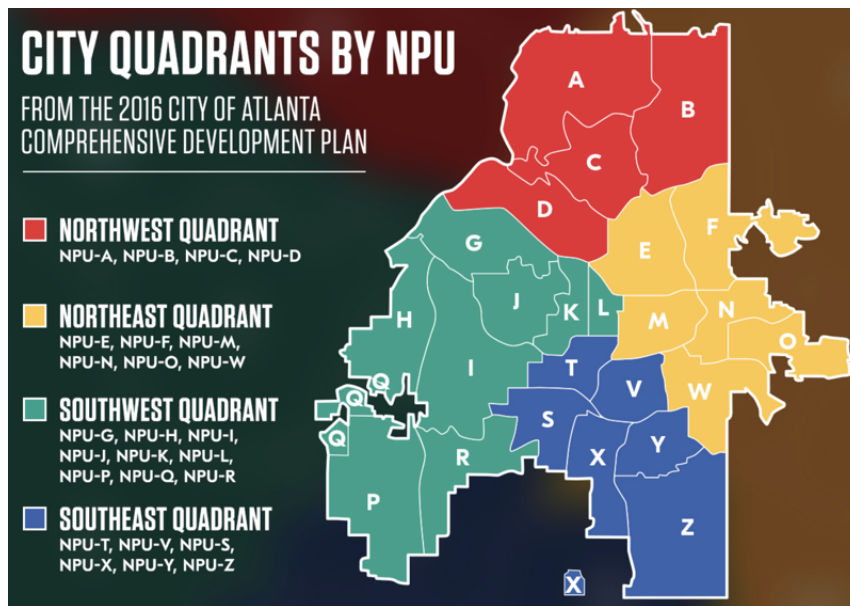

Get Involved and Stay Informed with the NPU

On the third Monday of every month at 7pm - that includes tomorrow, August 16 - you can directly express concerns to City officials and provide input on developing plans that could impact our daily lives here in Morningside. You can hear updates from and ask questions of representatives from major departments and services in our City government - including Police, Fire, Public Works/Solid Waste, Code Enforcement, Watershed Management and elected officials. You can also comment and vote on matters of land use, alcohol license applications, proposed legislation and special events/festivals. It all happens at the [Neighborhood Planning Unit \(NPU\)](#) meetings. And unless you've had to attend because of a zoning variance request, many neighbors do not know about this critical opportunity to seek answers and influence change.

Atlanta is comprised of over 240 unique neighborhoods, which are grouped in to 25 volunteer managed NPUs - most represented by a civic or neighborhood association. These citizen advisory councils make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council. [The NPU system was established in 1974](#) by the late Mayor Maynard Jackson to provide an opportunity for all residents to actively participate in the [Comprehensive Development Plan](#) (the official citywide vision for growth over the next five, ten, and fifteen years). It is the official mechanism for City officials to receive input and is specified in the city charter.

Morningside Lenox Park is in [NPU F](#), along with Virginia-Highland, Piedmont Heights, Lindridge Martin Manor, Edmund Park and Druid Hills (northern section including Emory/CDC/CHOA). Meetings are currently held virtually via Zoom. All are welcome to attend, but only registered residents and business owners are allowed to vote on matters before the NPU. [Click here](#) to register; proof of residency must be provided to verify eligibility. Agendas are generally posted two weeks ahead of each meeting. Check their website or [social media channels](#) for updates and committee schedules.

Take advantage of this open forum. If you attend these and our monthly MLPA meetings (which occur on the second Monday of each month), you will learn more than you ever thought possible about what's happening in our neighborhood and city - and you'll probably be one of the first to know it!



Cheshire Bridge Road

The Atlanta Fire Rescue Department has been busy on Cheshire Bridge Road. The most recent fires last week that devastated [Las Margaritas](#) and [the bridge](#) over Peachtree Creek have put added strain on businesses there, which have already struggled with the 85 collapse and COVID. In partnership with the Piedmont Heights Civic Association, MLPA encourages our residents to support the restaurants, non-profit organizations, stores and shops on this major street. - [Colonnade Restaurant Inc.](#): We will open at 5:00 tonight, you just have to avoid the stretch between Woodland and Liddell (posted 8/5/21)
- [Distinctive Appliances](#): Please be advised that our showroom currently cannot be accessed from the north side of Cheshire Bridge Rd due to a temporary closure. Our showroom remains accessible from the southwest end of Cheshire Bridge Rd via Piedmont Rd. We apologize for any inconvenience.
- [Nakato Japanese Restaurant](#): Yes, it can take up to a year to reopen the bridge over Cheshire Bridge, but luckily our guests can simply take the Monroe Drive Exit off of I-85 and loop around to Piedmont and Cheshire Bridge. Thankfully, it's just as easy to get to Nakato Japanese Restaurant as it ever was! (posted 8/11/21)

Security

In July, the monthly MLPA meeting focused on neighborhood security and sought to identify neighborhood actions that might address the recent uptick in crime in the neighborhood. More than 130 persons participated in the Zoom meeting; and thru a survey, about 30 persons stepped forward as volunteers to work on actions mentioned in the meeting. Neighbors completed a survey to indicate their area(s) of interest and whether they wanted to participate as a team leader or member.

The work effort was divided into 4 subject areas: alcohol license enforcement, police presence, traffic calming, and community and advocacy ([See Figure](#)). An MLPA Partner was identified for each team to provide guidance and money/resources and to connect with MLPA board as needed. In addition, the team work was organized to establish clear roles and responsibilities that did not conflict with ongoing MLPA Board and Committee work. Team leads plan to report regular updates to MLPA Board Partners and Board to highlight learnings, progress, and obstacles. The deadline to apply is Monday, August 23.

Applicants must be at least 21 years and be a resident of Metro Atlanta or work in Metro Atlanta. Please know you must attend 6 out of 8 classes in order to complete the program.

Legacy Grant Renovation Plans and Schedule

The Park Pride Legacy Grant for Sidney Marcus Park is still waiting on the building permits to start renovation of the park. The good news is that we are through most of the steps and will be on to buildings/structures for final approval. Since the only structure in this renovation is a raised walkway down from the tribute area - and there are no new structures of consequence - the final step should go quickly.

[Friends of Sidney Marcus Park](#) (FSMP) expect the breaking ground ceremony to be in September and hopefully the project will be finished by the end of the year.

The latest permit approval was from the arborist. You will see new white X's marked on three trees near the Sherwood entrance. These are going to be removed as part of the renovation. We will recompense tree planting to make up for them. We have gotten some ideas from the neighbors, but we welcome your suggestions on how the next generation understory of trees at the park should look.

Tributes and Tribute Pavers

FSMP is ordering the engraved pavers for the tribute area. It is not too late to get your tribute to the Friends group for inclusion in this new ring of pavers around the 2005 tribute pavers. There are 48 engraved pavers on the way thanks to a generous neighborhood and Friends group. The double wide pavers on the corners of the new square will be tributes to the MLPA, Park Pride and Friends of Sidney Marcus Park. The fourth will be a 40th Anniversary of the Park tribute.

With this renovation of the park, FSMP recently received a generous donation to replace the swing bench in the lower area. The landscape architect is working to place the new one, along with the 4 new benches planned for the park.

Quarterly Park Food Drive

July 30 and 31 might not have been the best timing for the FSMP quarterly food drive at the park (due to coinciding with the end of summer and start of school), but the need in the community continues relentlessly. The fourth Sidney Marcus Park Quarterly Food was still very much a success thanks to a truly giving community. 419 pounds of food was delivered to the Food Pantry at Intown Collaborative Ministries. This food drive program has become a strong and steady contribution to our intown Atlanta community. Look for the next food drive at the park in early November.

Art at the Park

The Information Kiosk, along with the upcoming renovation, bring art opportunities to the park. The Friends group is seeking neighborhood art and artists to display at the kiosk. The Morningside Community Recreation Center Re-Opens

The newly renovated Morningside Recreation Center is now open for business. Built in 1953 by the City Parks Department, the new Rec features a large multi-purpose meeting room, kitchen, game room, full-size gymnasium, and soccer field.

A city-run after-school program is available Monday thru Friday from 2:45 to 6:00 pm, staffed with 15-to-1 ratio. Activities include: computer learning lab, homework tutoring, soccer, basketball, football, hockey, cheerleading, arts & crafts, a game room & movies. The Morningside Rec offers these after-school programs for \$80/month. Adult programs are offered Monday thru Thursday from 6:00 to 9:00 pm. Your input is needed to complete our fall schedule. Suggested programs: Men's Basketball, Co-ed Volleyball, Yoga & Aerobics. The Facility will be open on Saturdays for Community Members!

You can reserve the Center for family or community events such as birthday parties, baby showers, neighborhood meetings & celebrations! Come by to meet the staff and see the programs in action.

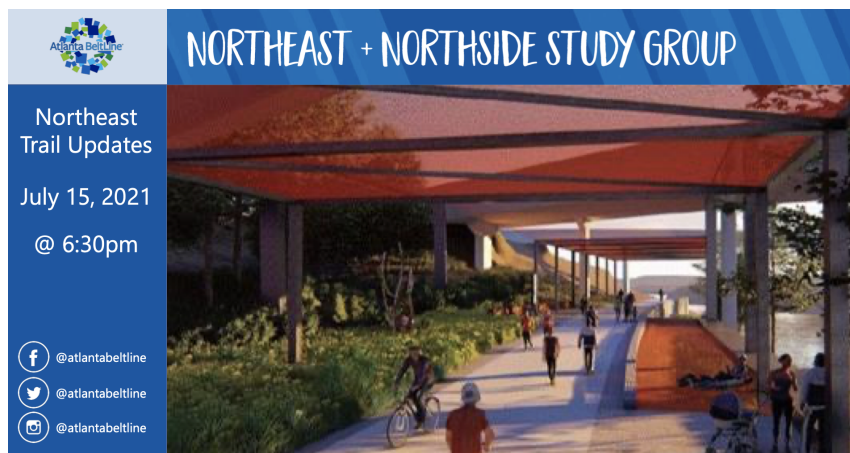
