President's Note

Hope you are all enjoying these mornings and evenings with a touch of fall. There is a LOT going on – including recruiting for MLPA board positions in 2022. If you have any interest whatsoever to learn about what kind of commitment is required or what kind of opportunities we have, please contact me at president@mlpa.org. I insist – everyone involved already has other priorities in life and we are grateful to have people just join us to do what they can. I am only committing to one more year of service if I am reappointed by the nominating committee, so we need a pipeline of people to lead the organization and its committees. Meanwhile, on with the show...

1. Traffic Concerns. We are hearing from a lot of people that live along the Wildwood corridor about the increased volume and speed of cars coming through the neighborhood. We are looking at several alternatives to help, whether funding digital speed readers, getting additional stop signs or speed humps, and looking for ways to require permitted parking on streets close to Cheshire Bridge. In the meantime, please continue to leverage 311 to complain about traffic issues, request speed humps, etc. Please continue to send us specific problems so we can document and use as evidence, as we anticipate a meeting soon with Council Member Ide on several ideas.

2. Election Education. In our monthly board meeting we were joined by two city council candidates for our district (Courtney DeDi and Alex Wan), and it was great to be able to hear directly from them about their backgrounds and priorities. We are going to invite City Council President candidates to introduce themselves at our October board meetings in hopes we can also offer the chance to hear from them – and understand their positions on security in particular. You can visit www.voteatl.org to learn more about any candidate for any city race – PLEASE get smart about these races and take them seriously to help with so many of the broader problems affecting us.

3. New Alcohol License @ Piedmont & Monroe. We are trying to get more vigilant about the abuse of alcohol licenses that is clearly a source of problems on Cheshire Bridge. In our Monday evening meeting we heard from the owner and attorney of October Kitchen & Bar, which is seeking an alcohol license for their new restaurant at the corner of Piedmont and Monroe (formerly HobNob). We have concerns about the concept (given the owner's part ownership of The GOAT Club on Cheshire Bridge and the proposed usage of hookahs on the patio) and deferred a vote while working with the owner to establish operating guidelines as far as closing hours, noise and street parking nearby in the event that the license is approved by the review board - but we encourage all neighbors who are concerned to join this Monday evening's NPU meeting to weigh in on their decision to endorse the license or not. We hope conditions will allow us to hold the family concerts planned for October and will communicate as such. Please consider helping us out in 2022!

District 6 City Council Forum

Four candidates are running to fill Jennifer Ide's seat: Justin Critz, Courtney DeDi, Kathryn Voelpel and Alex Wan. All four have committed to attend, and there will be an opportunity for neighbors to submit questions for candidates ahead of time. Tom Baxter, from Saporta Report, will be the moderator.

The city council's primary responsibilities are setting policies, ordinances, resolutions and rules for the city; adopting the annual budget; and providing oversight of the executive branch, including city departments. Fall Concert Series

I have lived in Morningside since 2013 and in Atlanta since 2004. I grew up in Columbus, GA where I graduated from The Brookstone School and Columbus State University. When I moved to Morningside in 2013, I found Morningside to be such a special place, with all its rich history, beautiful homes, diversity, proximity to other parts of the city, and lush parks and landscapes. One of the reasons I wanted to get involved in the neighborhood is that I realized, after moving to Morningside from Midtown, that there is no other place like it in the city. We need to preserve the history and the charm of what makes Morningside special.

My original career was not real estate but in corporate America, where I worked in product development and marketing for such companies as Char-Broil Gas Grills, Remington Arms, and Home Depot. I look at real estate as a vertical move from what I did in my previous positions. Houses are products and each has its own attributes (good and bad), and my job is to market

these products, remove obstacles, promote benefits, manage risks, and, sometimes, be the bearer of tough love to clients. This is not very different from what I did in corporate America. One thing I hear all the time from so many of my clients is they appreciate that I shoot "straight from the hip." I tell it like it is vs. telling them what they want to hear as that may not be accurate. I love that I made the change to go into real estate 8 years ago and have never looked back. The Atlanta Department of Transportation has completed the response and recovery efforts associated with the fire on August 4, 2021, which severely compromised the efficacy of Cheshire Bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek. Armour at Monroe Drive Updates

Many of us have encountered significant delays at the Monroe Drive and Armour Drive intersection in nearby Piedmont Heights. A project of the Georgia Department of Transportation, a roundabout is being installed due to high traffic volumes on the corridor (especially at peak hours) and a high number of crashes. At this Monday's MLPA meeting, our State House Representative Stacey Evans shared her frustrations with the implementation and now has a direct line to a project lead. MLPA Neighborhood Watch Program – We Need Street Captains

Neighborhood Watch Programs are the eyes and ears of the neighborhood for law enforcement personnel. The MLPA Neighborhood Watch Program is recognized by the City of Atlanta and is an ongoing effort to establish and maintain a broad communication network throughout the community. The benefits that Neighborhood Watch communities have experienced include:

- Reducing crime and fear of crime in our neighborhood. The neighbors, the stay-at-home Moms and Dads, the folks working from home, and the retirees, are the “eyes and ears” of the security patrol. With “eyes and ears” on every street, we can contribute to improving security in the community.
- Acting as a deterrent to criminal activity,
- Promoting positive communication and relationships within the neighborhood and with the police,
- Providing the APD with volunteer support year-round,
- And building a sense of community pride and unity.

Many thanks to Stephanie Aron for stepping forward to lead the Neighborhood Watch activities in the neighborhood. We are grateful for her volunteerism and commitment to the neighborhood. By way of an introduction... Stephanie was born in Atlanta and has lived in the City permanently since 1999, moving from Midtown to Downtown and then to Morningside in 2015. She has been involved in various business and civic organizations, including the Georgia Association for Women Lawyers (President, 2004), Commercial Real Estate Women Atlanta (President, 2006), and Atlanta Women's Foundation (Board Member 2010-2011). She graduated from the University of Georgia School of Law and started her firm in 1999, growing it until 2019 when she merged her real estate practice with Chamberlain Hrdlicka. She is now co-Managing Partner of the Atlanta office of Chamberlain. She is married to Chad Aron and mother of Mars Aron (Age 10), and believes that Morningside provides an idyllic life for its residents, and cannot imagine a better place to live.

The current MLPA Neighborhood Watch Program has more than 60 street captains, who notify neighbors about security issues thru the monthly MLPA Security Reports, be-on-the-lookout (BOLO) notices, and the monthly newsletters. 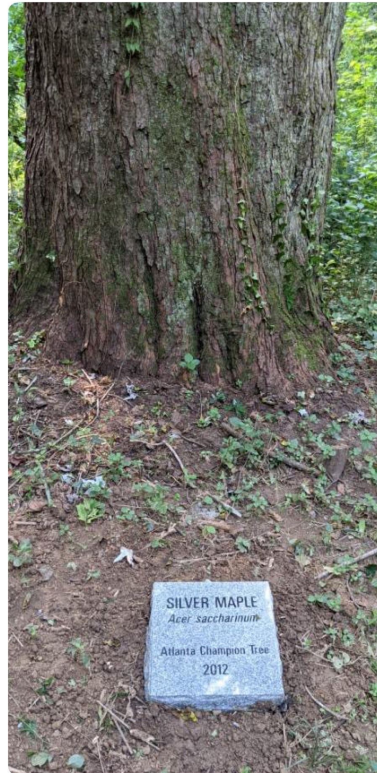
One zoning case was heard in August by the Zoning Committee and MLPA Board:

- Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulation to 1). reduce the required east side yard setback from 7 feet to 5 feet, and to 2). reduce the required rear yard from 15 feet to 3 feet in order to construct an accessory structure.

Morningside Champions Recognized

Did you know that Morningside Lenox Park is home to several champion trees? Do you even know what makes a champion tree?

Champion trees are recognized as among the largest of a species in a given area in a particular year. Our neighborhood is home to many champions, with 14 currently recognized in Herbert Taylor Park, Daniel Johnson Park and Noble Park. While the recognition of these dates back quite a while, it took neighborhood support from MLPA and grants from Park Pride to finally acquire the granite markers for the trees.

Then a small army of volunteers spent time digging holes, pouring in concrete and placing these stones by each champion tree. We will have a walk to show off the forest on Sunday, October 3 at 4:00 pm.

Sidney Marcus Park

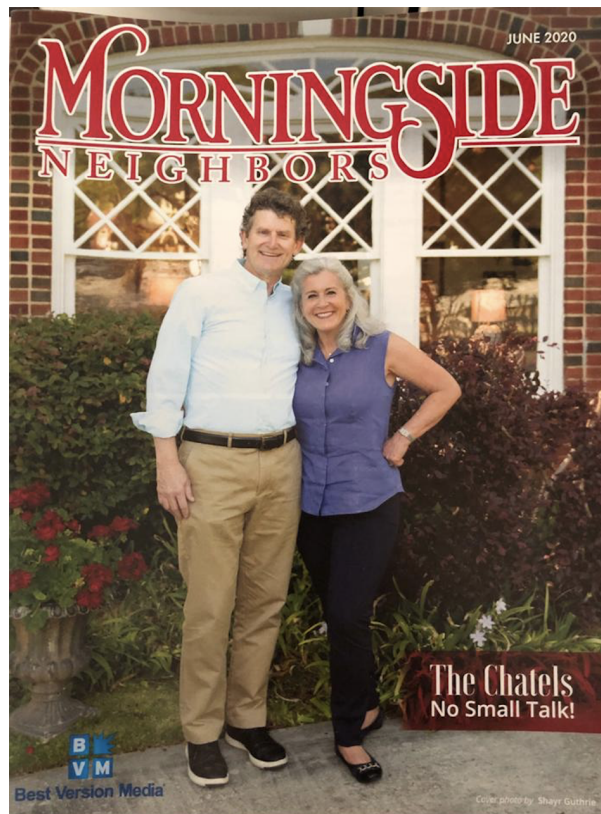

Morningside Pride and History

Pop Quiz: Where is a presidential monument in Morningside Lenox Park? Which president does it recognize? And for what occasion?

Answer: Wilson Park, the triangular park at the intersection of E. Morningside and N. Rock Springs roads, memorializes President Woodrow Wilson (1856-1924). Dedicated by the Atlanta Woman's Club on May 25, 1924, Wilson Park was planted with crepe myrtles and elm trees (which all later succumbed to Dutch elm disease).

Wilson practiced law for a while in Atlanta, and the text on the plaque reads: *The elm and crepe myrtle trees in this park and on these thoroughfares were planted by the Atlanta Women's Club as a living memorial to our great statesman, Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States, March 3, 1913 to March 4, 1921, commander in chief of this country during the Great World War, advocate of permanent world peace through the League of Nations based upon the brotherhood of mankind. Born Dec. 10, 1856, died Feb. 3, 1924. Dedicated this 23rd day of May, 1924.*

The [Atlanta Woman's Club](#) was started in 1895 and still exists today. The club is a non-profit philanthropic organization made up of professional women of all ages, races and religions who share a common goal: to work together to improve the local community, socially, physically, culturally and educationally.
