# **Security Patrol Vehicle Purchase**

As mentioned above, the MLPA is undertaking a search for a new vehicle for the Morningside Security Patrol. (The existing vehicle is a 2000 Chevy Malibu that has served the neighborhood well for many years.) The objective is to furnish the patrol with a safe vehicle that allows them to patrol safely, to provide security for the Morningside neighborhood, and to act as a roving deterrent for criminals.

The Security Committee took into consideration input from Patrol Lead Rick Vazquez, his team, MLPA members, and other neighborhood associations. The proposal is to purchase a compact or subcompact SUV with 1) Bluetooth optionality for ease of sending emails to neighbors who are out of town and have requested vacation patrol coverage; and 2) with rear-view and back-up cameras for more easily maneuvering curved and/or narrow driveways during house checks. #### **Cheshire Bridge Demolition Completed**

On December 1, the Atlanta Department of Transportation's Communications Team shared the following update. Please continue to support the many businesses that are OPEN on both sides of the bridge - including in the Manchester district. You can also <a href="mailto:email

The City of Atlanta Department of Transportation (ATLDOT) is pleased to announce demolition of the Cheshire Bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek has been completed as scheduled.

The bridge has been closed to all modes of transportation since August 2021, when a fire severely compromised its safety and efficacy. Demolition work began nearly four (4) weeks ago and has steadily progressed without major obstacles. Crews will continue to remove demolition debris from the area through the end of the week.

Currently, the procurement process is underway, with the bridge rebuild estimated to begin in the first quarter of 2022.

ATLDOT reminds the public that pedestrians are restricted from entering the bridge construction zone until the demolition and rebuild are complete. For your safety, please do not enter the creek bed, sloping, and fenced off bridge areas on either side of the creek. ## Fire Station #19 Renovation Underway

Located in Virginia-Highland, Fire Station #19 has graciously and steadfastly served our Morningside community decade after decade. The station is currently undergoing a much-needed and long-awaited renovation. As such, crews and equipment have been temporarily relocated. The project is expected to take about nine months.

#### From the Virginia-Highland Voice

In early September, Station 19's firefighting and EMT teams redeployed to nearby stations 15 (on 10th Street) and 29 (on Monroe Drive.) Even a temporary departure of this competent group of professionals leaves us uneasy. We already miss them; it feels like they have been here for a hundred years.

In fact, it's only been 96. Opened in 1925, FS19 is Atlanta's oldest operating fire fighting facility. Organized efforts to keep it operable have been underway in various forms for over a decade, accelerating in 2015 when the city formally considered finding a new site.

The prospect of a relocation was demoralizing and alarming. 19's fire and EMT personnel have assisted hundreds of residents in fire events and medical emergencies (including this writer), and the structure is an official and unofficial community center and landmark. For decades, firefighters have conducted tours of the station and hosted thousands of local children on the equipment.

The eventual decision to remain at the site and renovate was a huge relief to VaHi and Morningside residents - perhaps a bit prematurely. Fundraising was a formidable task. The arc of planning to approval to design to costing to contract to permitting took several years, not months. Three new chiefs took office over that span, and each left evidence of having reviewed - and re-reviewed - the decision to keep the station. (Our determined local council members were front and center in these moments.) ...

#### Morningside Nature Preserve

City of Atlanta Parks has temporarily closed the Morningside Nature Preserve (MNP) suspension bridge. The bridge's current condition is a serious safety hazard. The Department of Parks and Recreation's Commissioner recently shared that civil engineers will be evaluating the bridge in the next few weeks, and repairs will be outsourced soon thereafter. The boardwalk between the Lenox Road entrance and the bridge will be fixed, as well.

Without the bridge, MNP is divided into two parts on either side of South Fork Peachtree Creek. To reach the east side of South Fork Peachtree Creek (stairs, boardwalk, beach area), use the Lenox Road entrance. To reach the west side of South Fork Peachtree Creek trails, use the Wellbourne Drive entrance or the unmarked Wildwood entrance. Please plan accordingly.

## Sidney Marcus Park

On December 10, the *Friends of Sidney Marcus Park* (*FSMP*) hosted a groundbreaking event to celebrate the end of a long wait for permission from the City of Atlanta and the Department of Parks and Recreation to start a major park renovation. <u>Construction will start in the new few weeks and the majority of Sidney Marcus Park - including the playground area - will be closed. A few of the picnic tables near Cumberland Rd should still be available for use. The upcoming project is slated to cost \$200,000 and will focus on drainage, erosion control and watershed management. Based on the FSMP Vision Plan, it is the first major step towards realizing the vision for the park.</u>


The festive celebration featured a presentation from John Pappas of FSMP, Patrick Hand of Integrated Land Design, music from the Pandemic Players and some sweet holiday treats. The groubreaking event also capped off the 5th quarterly Sidney Marcus Park Food Drive to benefit Intown Collaborative Ministries.

#### **Zoning**

Two zoning case were heard in December by the Zoning Committee and MLPA Board:

- <u>V-21-299</u> 626 East Morningside Dr.
  - Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulation to 1). reduce the required west side vard setback from 7 feet to 3 feet, and 2). Increase the height of an accessory structure from 20 feet to 24.5 feet and 3). Increase the maximum total floor area of an accessory structure from 30% of the main structure to 53% of the main structure in order to construct two accessory structures (garage/carriage house and a pool pavilion)
  - Approved
- <u>V-21-309</u> 13 Highland Park Lane
  - Applicant seeks a variance from the zoning regulation to reduce the required north side yard setback from 5 feet to 3 feet 4 inches in order to enclose an area under an existing deck.
  - Approved

The next zoning meeting will be held online via Zoom on January 4 at 7:00 pm. Any neighbors interested in variance outcomes should come to these meetings. All neighbors are welcome to attend; come to three meetings to qualify to vote.
