1. Thanks Sharla – and congrats Camille! Many of you know about our neighborhood's Master Plan approved by City Council in 2018 – and that since 2019 a volunteer Master Plan Implementation Committee has been working away on several projects. After three years of leadership, Sharla Borghorst has decided to pass the baton – we thank her for her time and dedication and are delighted that our current traffic chair Camille Richardson will take the role going forward. In addition to being passionate about traffic calming efforts, Camille is also a member of the Morningside Elementary PTA Executive Committee, so we appreciate all she does for the neighborhood!

2. Pothole Patrol – you're hired. Council Member Alex Wan has launched an effort to consolidate information to fix damaged or outdated traffic infrastructure across neighborhoods in his district. Potholes, faded/damaged street signs, crosswalks needing enhancement...let's serve them all up. I am working with Camille on a process to take your requests easily with the detail needed to get ATLDOT moving – look out for details in subsequent communications.

3. Size doesn't matter. (Poetic license here.) You've seen my pleas to get involved perhaps at the board level...but not all ways to get involved require the same amount of time. Did you also know we have several committees that support our efforts on priorities, such as security and membership? No matter what amount of time you have to offer, there is a way to get involved! 

In general when I see it, I alert our security patrol and they have been quick to let them know it is illegal and ask them to leave. If you see it, feel free to <u>email</u> me the location in the moment, and I'll continue alerting the patrol on duty of incidences. You can also call the non-emergency 311 line for <u>assistance with quality of life situations</u>, since we know this is not an easy solve.

Many of you also are aware there was a shooting last Saturday evening on Middlesex following a party among teens that suffered small injuries. We are naturally alarmed about any gun violence in our neighborhood. We are in touch with Zone 6 leadership to ensure we have the correct details of what happened and who will be held responsible - more information below.

Shooting Incident on Middlesex

NPU-F had a large turnout at last night's meeting, in part, to hear from the Atlanta Police Department (APD) about the shooting incident that occurred Saturday evening August 13, 2022 on Middlesex.

Major Andrea Webster, the new Commander of Zone 6, was present to discuss the investigation into the shooting incident outside of a house party. Two male students were shot in the arm, were transported to the hospital, and are expected to make a full recovery. The APD is working closely with the school system. The parents of the student who hosted the party are cooperating fully with the APD. This is an ongoing investigation as the APD continues to interview students who were present at the time and to review videos.

The incident occurred outside when uninvited students from another high school showed up. An argument and altercations ensued, and the situation escalated to gunfire. Atlanta Public Schools Updates

On August 8, the Atlanta Board of Education voted 7-1 to open a new K-5 school at the former Inman Middle School site. As previously shared, some streets in Morningside have been rezoned from Morningside Elementary to the new K-5, which will open next school year. <u>Click here for the</u> <u>interactive Board Approved 2023-2024 Elementary School Zones map.</u> As we do for all of the public schools in our Midtown Cluster, the MLPA will also support this new elementary school.

The renovation of the Morningside Elementary building on E. Rock Springs (pictured above) is nearing completion, but behind schedule. The substantial completion date was moved from July 25 to November 4 and (hopefully) there will be a certificate of occupancy shortly thereafter.

Northeast Study Group -Subarea 6 Master Plan Update

Beltline Subarea 6 Public Meeting

<u>Atlanta BeltLine, Inc.</u> (ABI) continues its process of updating the BeltLine Subarea 6 (SA6) Master Plan with their second round of engagement. The Subarea 6 geography includes neighborhoods of Ansley Park, Midtown, Morningside/Lenox Park, Piedmont Heights, Sherwood Forest, and Virginia-Highland. The purpose of this meeting is to present the findings from the design workshops that took place May 16th through May 26th of 2022. They will then review the draft master plan goals and receive your feedback on the draft recommendations for land use (e.g. mixed use, housing, commercial services), mobility (e.g. trails, sidewalks, bikes, transit), parks and greenspace.

Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative Public Comment Survey

MARTA is seeking your input on the Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative. This project is analyzing multiple alternatives for high-capacity transit service between Lindbergh Center station and either Avondale or Decatur rail station. Key activity centers in the corridor include the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Emory University Hospital, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta - Egleston, and Atlanta VA Medical Center.

Comments on the proposed alternatives are being accepted for 45 days, beginning Thursday, July 14 and **ending Wednesday, August 30, 2022**. <u>You can share your input by taking this survey.</u>



Cheshire Bridge Update

This latest update of construction activities for the rebuild of Cheshire Bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek was shared on August 11. The projected opening of at least one lane of traffic in each direction remains by October 31, 2022.

- Crews completed drilling for the bridge footings in July. Installation of the caisson, rebar, and concrete footings is currently underway.
- A new utility pole also has been installed and anchored on the far end of the northside parking lot.
- Beam installations will begin once the bridge foundation is set.
- Sewer line replacements also will be installed later this summer.



Piedmont Enhancement Project

From Atlanta Gas Light:

I wanted to reach out and share an update with you about Atlanta Gas Light's Piedmont Enhancement Project. We are nearing the finish line and working on restoration activities along the project path. However, like many industries, we are dealing with supply chain issues. Our construction barriers have been removed from Segment 1, Segment 2 and Segment 3. In the coming days, crews will be removing our construction barriers from Segment 4, weather permitting. You may see crews return to the area to complete final restoration activities. We will continue to provide project updates as needed. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we have worked to make this important system improvement.


