President's Note

I don't know about you, but I feel ten pounds lighter after getting through the stress of midterms. Fortunately I have Thanksgiving soon to regain them!

1. Annual Meeting. Thanks to the 70+ neighbors and local and state officials who attended our annual meeting virtually. See below for a recap of 2022 highlights, updates to the by-laws and a link to information if you couldn't join and want to relive the moment!

2. Infrastructure. Per our previous communications, you have until **TOMORROW (Friday, November 18)** to register any opportunity to fix neighborhood infrastructure such as faded signs, damaged curbs or other needs from the City. Thanks to Alex Wan's office we are collecting your information [here](#) and will submit to them this Friday for them to track progress.

3. Secure your holidays. On Monday night Zone 2 Commander Major Mitchell joined us and indicated car break-ins and vehicle thefts are indeed on the rise although major crimes are down. In addition to the usual reminder to not keep things in plain sight in parked cars, he advised about not letting cars run unattended during the cold weather as they have recently seen two cars stolen in such cases. If you are concerned about packages during the holidays, Amazon Locker is also a great option if you are willing to be slightly inconvenienced but want absolute certainty of getting what you paid for. Don't forget your vacation patrols either!

Major Mitchell also reiterated that while Atlanta Police Department is thrilled to see their new chief come from within, they are still struggling with retention and recruiting across the department. Anytime is a great time to thank the people that serve us, but please be mindful to say it yourself if you see a police officer or other city employee during this time of year – it's greatly appreciated and helps to keep the hardworking people feeling recognized even when things are tough. The MLPA looks forward to providing its annual holiday meals to Precinct 6 and Fire Station 29 in December.

If you saw Council Member Wan's newsletter yesterday (also linked further below), you saw that on October 27 the License Review Board submitted a recommendation to the Mayor to impose a 30-day alcohol suspension and \$2,500 fine on Allure Gentlemen's Club. In our meeting Major Mitchell joined Wan in encouraging all neighbors to voice your support of this recommendation by emailing Mayor Dickens (adickens@atlantaga.gov) and Chief of Staff Odie Donald (odie@atlantaga.gov). I personally will email him asking him to uphold his original campaign promises to be more vigilant on this front – let us know if you'd like language to include in your own email.

But now back to (family-friendly) celebrations...have a wonderful holiday season!

Annual Meeting Recap

Thanks to all the neighbors who joined us on Monday evening for our annual meeting. We were fortunate to also have Council Member Alex Wan, State Representative Stacey Evans, Major Ailen Mitchell and Captain Ben Vayens from APD Zone 2, and of course our own security patrol lead Rick Vazquez. You will be happy to know Council Member Wan is dialed in to continued improvement on homelessness and alcohol licenses – both of which affect our crime levels – and is also working really proactively with MLPA to address infrastructure opportunities and coordinate key spending opportunities.

We enjoyed sharing updates from the year, notably:

- Our new patrol car and new security monitoring signs
- Several traffic calming projects legislated, many of which are already in place
- Supercharged social event calendar
- Significant improvements and repairs across parks and greenspaces
- Increased membership revenue and project commitments

But don't take our word for it – see it for yourself! You can browse through highlights and pictures [here](#). You'll also see our acknowledgement of many of the countless volunteers across the neighborhood who work with us to make things happen.

We also voted to approve the nominated slate of directors per our communication on October 31 and update two [by-laws](#): one to entrust the nominating committee to do its work on behalf of the neighborhood in recruiting and vetting a slate of candidates and another to formalize a recent resolution allowing our Treasurer to apply for credit as needed and approved by the Board (this essentially means getting an MLPA credit card to then immediately pay many of our bills and centralize accounts payable instead of reimbursing individuals.)

Looking forward to next year we talked about many areas of focus, including:

- Continued attention to traffic calming (results of the recent neighborhood survey including 350+ responses will help shape this)
- Working to ensure upcoming T-SPLOST funds allocated to several of our parks are used on the right projects
- An MLPA website redesign to improve functionality and enhance branding
- Our Centennial and the events/ways we hope to celebrate it in 2023!

As always we are looking for volunteers! We have a lot of traffic projects we want to complete, we still have many streets without street captains and the Centennial committee is looking for people to help lead some of the events in mind. MLPA is also happy to support the second annual Virginia-Highland District's Winterfest.

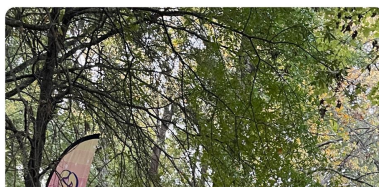

Public Updates on Route & Vehicle Analysis



MARTA's Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative Updates

The [Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative](#) is MARTA's proposed new high-capacity transit service that would provide a connection between two existing heavy rail lines through a major employment and institutional corridor in the Atlanta region. Key activity centers in the corridor are the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Emory University, Emory University Hospital, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta – Egleston, Lindbergh Center, and Atlanta VA Medical Center.

MARTA evaluated 10 alternatives in the Screen 1 process, including 4 bus rapid transit (BRT) and 6 light rail transit (LRT) alternatives. BRT is a transit service that provides premium, rail-like service that operates primarily in dedicated running ways. LRT is a transit service that operates on embedded tracks in dedicated lanes and exclusive guideway. MARTA has completed the Screen 1 evaluation and identified three route and vehicle options to carry into the next phase of study. Click the links below to learn more.

In this meeting you will be presented the results of the Screen I Analysis, how it informed the three alternatives under study, and how they could improve transit access and connectivity to the corridor. Attending the meeting will provide more opportunities to:

What to do with your "Boos" and Other Yard Signs

Whether you have yard signs from Halloween or the recent elections, do you know what to do with them when you're done? If not, Morningside Elementary's Sustainability Community (SWAG) has the answer for you! On November 1st, the SWAG committee began collecting yard signs for recycling - just in time to keep CHOA Boos and all other corrugated plastic yard signs out of the landfill. Collection bins will remain under the awning to the left of the main entrance at MES @ Inman - 774 Virginia Ave - until APS Winter Break (December 16).

Plastic tops must be separated from the metal base and each should be placed in the appropriate bin.

Please note: Yard signs placed in Atlanta's curbside recycling bins are considered contamination and are sent to a landfill, so please use this new recycling option instead!



Cheshire Bridge Update

On Monday, October 31, 2022, the Atlanta Department of Transportation opened two lanes - one northbound and one southbound - for the partial reopening of Cheshire Bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek. C. W. Matthews construction crews performed work both daily and nightly to help accomplish the reopening as scheduled. The remaining lanes will be reopened in Spring 2023 following the completion of ongoing utility relocation work.

- The westside pedestrian sidewalk has reopened.
 - Utility relocation work will continue throughout the remainder of this project. This work may include temporary lane shifts at times.
 - No full road closures are anticipated during this final phase of construction.
 - All lanes and utility relocations are expected to be completed in Spring 2023.

On November 12, more than 30 volunteers planted native flora in areas of HTDJ where invasive plants had been removed over the past year. Neighborhood volunteers were joined by groups from Emory Cares Alumni Association and Hands On Atlanta through their partnership with Park Pride.

The group installed ninety plants ranging from ferns to flowering plants that will attract native insects, birds, and wildlife adding to our parks' diversity. Prior to the planting, the areas were prepared by removing invasive plants and spreading an entire truckload of mulch!

As the saying goes, many hands make light work. We certainly proved that on Saturday when what looked like an impossible undertaking was easily accomplished "with a little help from our friends".

Friends of HTDJ invite you to join our regular workdays, the second Saturday of each month. We meet at the kiosk at 1343 Pasadena Av. at 9:00am for introductions and a short orientation. Then we set off to remove invasive plants that threaten the tree canopy and plant native species to support the park's wildlife. 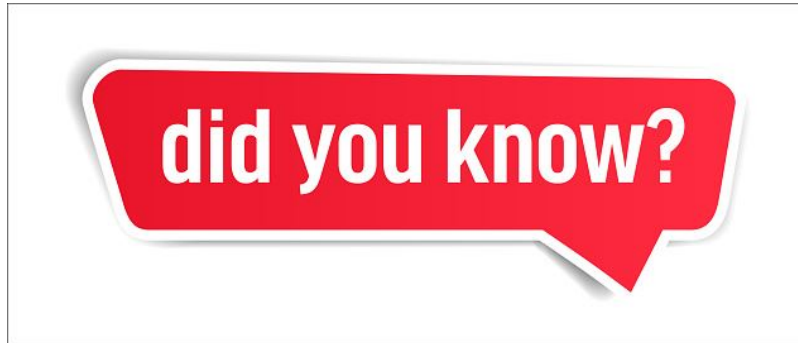
