Halloween Candy Crawl


It's back! Join our Morningside Village businesses for trick-or-treating along N Highland Ave on

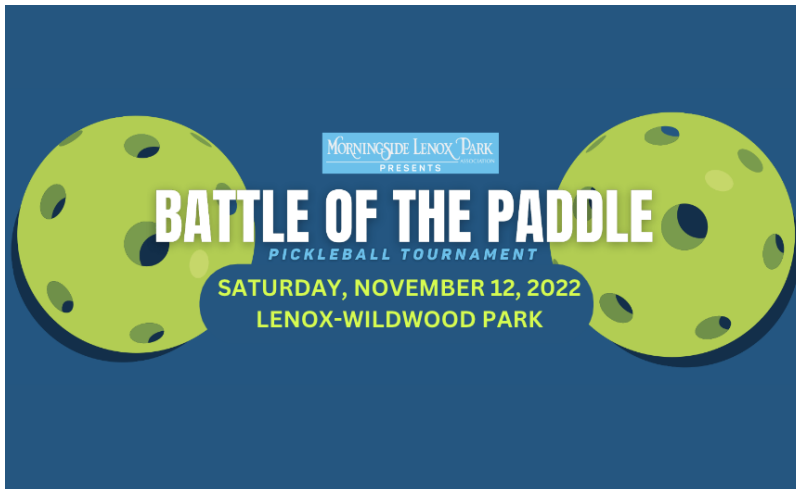




New Moms' Brunch

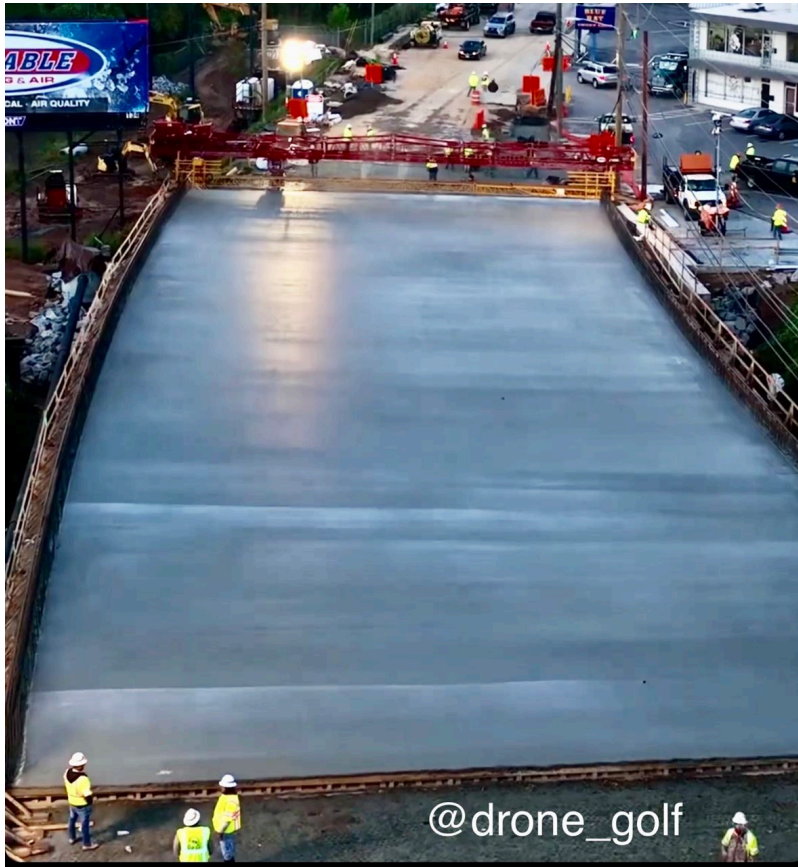


Morningside Garden Club

The first meeting of the Morningside Garden Club after a long break due to COVID also brought an end to the recent dry spell we've had here! Our group of diggers gathered at Pat & Bill Russell's screened porch on Yorkshire that overlooks their beautiful terraced garden. It is home to many native plants and a haven for neighborhood birds.

Our speaker for the evening was Suzy Nicksic, Georgia Native Plant Society Intown Chapter Restoration Chair. She provided a practical approach for transitioning our yards to include more native species that will support wildlife. Among the benefits of native plants are lower maintenance needs and their ability to support native species. When she moved to the area, her yard was covered in English ivy, asian azaleas, rose of sharon and the usual nursery stock. She has mowed and replaced with a variety of native shrubs, flowering plants, and grasses - as a result, her yard attracts a wide variety of butterflies and birds.

Morningside Garden Club will take the holidays off but return to regular meetings in January. Trail Improvements

If you have not already, take a few minutes to enjoy a bit of nature right here in the middle of Morningside with a hike through Herbert Taylor Park & Daniel Johnson Park (HTDJ). The Friends of HTDJ recently received a grant from Park Pride, along with matching funds from our members and the MLPA to improve the trails in the park.

This natural park located at the confluence of Rock Creek and South Fork Peachtree Creek is subject to flooding when heavy rains cause runoff from our neighbors, Emory and the CDC, and a series of new developments in the watershed. To make navigating the creeks less treacherous, a series of stone steps has been added.

Friends of HTDJ invite you to join our regular workdays, the second Saturday of each month. We meet at the kiosk at 1343 Pasadena Av. at 9:00am for introductions and a short orientation. Then we set off to remove invasive plants that threaten the tree canopy and plant native species to support the park's wildlife. Bring water to drink and your favorite gardening tools, or borrow some of ours!





Sidney Marcus Park

There is no shortage of parties, celebrations and play dates at the park. Sidney Marcus Park continues to be a hub for the community.

The Friends of Sidney Marcus Park have been working closely with Intown Collaborative Ministries and seeing first hand the real need for food. Our food drives are very much needed and it is not letting up! Especially with these prices!

We continue, what is now a tradition at the park, our next quarterly food drive is:

- **Friday, November 4, 9:00 to 11:00am**
- **Saturday, November 5, 9:00 to 11:00am**

What the food pantry is doing is making up "one week bags"; one that is for people that have kitchens and one for people that are homeless. While it is contrary to your sense of buying power, smaller containers, those with "pop tops", and proteins (**peanut butter, tuna, canned meat, cereal**) are at the top of the list.

But alongside this priority are two things: **bottled water** and **personal hygiene products**. Regardless, anything you can spare is valuable.

Our August food drive delivered 645 pounds of food. Let's beat it in November!



No Dumping in the Parks

As we enter the season of fallen leaves and pumpkins, this is a friendly reminder that it is illegal to dump yard waste and debris into City of Atlanta parks. "With so many communities bordering parkland, it is not surprising that park neighbors occasionally enter into activities that go beyond their property lines. However, encroachments damage park resources. Piles of yard waste attract rodents and snakes and may introduce destructive, invasive plants into natural areas." There was one zoning case heard by the Zoning Committee and MLPA Board this month.

[V-22-149](#) 750 Courtenay Ct NE

- Applicant seeks a variance to reduce the western side-yard setback from 7ft to 0ft 6in, reduce the eastern side-yard setback from 7ft to 3ft, reduce the rear-yard setback from 15ft to 10ft and to increase the lot coverage from the existing 52.2% to 53% for construction of additions to an existing single-family dwelling.

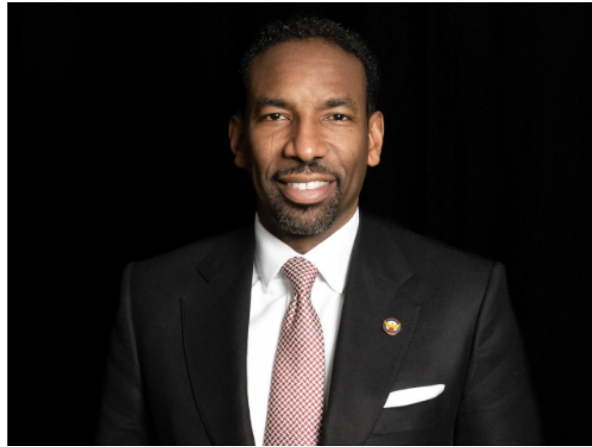

After COVID kept us out of school for a year, we spent last year rebuilding our team. This year we need your help because this amazing team is attracting fantastic talent. Unfortunately, approximately 20% of our students can't afford the team fee or travel with our team. That's where I'm hoping Factory Automation could help.

Plus our award-winning drones team and "BizOps" team bring robotics into the community and elementary schools around the state. Our overall annual operating budget for 2022-2023 to accomplish our goals is \$96,000. As an Atlanta Public School, we have limited resources, and depend on the generosity of sponsors, donors, and supporters like you, in our community to continue our team's success.
