#### **Traffic Calming**

The MLPA's Traffic Calming Committee has been hard at work trying to make our streets safer and slower. With the help of Alex Wan and his office, five traffic calming measures were recently legislated for our neighborhood (not listed in any particular order):

- 1. Four-way stop at Lenox Rd and Wildwood Rd \*\*The current stop signs on Lenox near Berkshire/Johnson were misplaced by ATLDOT. The signs were to be installed at the Lenox/Wildwood intersection further north, closer to Lenox-Wildwood Park. ATLDOT is aware and the stop signs should be relocated.
- 2. Pedestrian crosswalk across N Highland Ave at Morningside Village
- 3. Speed tables on Wildwood Rd between Lenox Rd and Wellbourne Dr
- 4. Four-way stop at Berkshire Rd and E Sussex Rd
- 5. Three-way stop at E Morningside and Cumberland PI

#### **Reigniting the Clean Car Campaign**

The car break-ins have returned to Morningside Village. We have numerous anecdotal reports of incidents there in recent weeks. Unfortunately, in one case, a firearm that was left on the floorboard of a car under a pile of clothes was stolen. Across Atlanta, nearly 1300 guns have been stolen from vehicles so far in 2022.

<u>Please do not leave anything in your car</u>, including GPS and mounts; cell phones; laptop/tablet computers; cords and power sources for electronic devices; book bags, brief cases, shopping bags and purses; money, bills or coins; firearms.


Car break-ins are Morningside's most prevalent crime (11 reported in July, 13 reported in August). These are undercounts of the occurrence of this crime for 2 reasons: 1) many victims are unwilling to wait for the police to arrive to file a report; 2) multiple incidents on the same street are counted as one incident. Only one of the recent anecdotal incidents in Morningside Village is listed in the Atlanta Police Department (APD) crime database.

We are working with the APD to make better use of residential and APD cameras to address this concern. For persons who have been victimized multiple times, police recommend leaving the car unlocked and cleaned out.

Best practices for reporting car break-Ins are provided below and include instructions on how to share relevant camera footage with the APD. These practices are also applicable to porch package thefts. Best practices to be followed by the victims of car break-ins and package thefts:

- 1) Call 911 to report incident.
- 2) Wait for the officer to take the incident report.
- 3) Check your home camera for any footage that might be helpful to the police.
- 4) Check in with neighbors who have home cameras that may have relevant footage; you can also ask your street captain to share this request with your neighbors.
- 5) If you have camera footage that **clearly** shows the suspect vehicle and the approximate date and time that the suspects were in the area, send the footage to <a href="mailto:zone6cid@atlantaga.gov">zone6cid@atlantaga.gov</a>. Be sure to include your name and the report number of your incident.
- 6) Ask the officer if he knows about nearby APD license plate reader cameras that may have relevant footage. Morningside has 8 such cameras plus numerous others nearby that are maintained by the APD. You must be able to provide a description of the suspect vehicle and the time when it was seen on your camera or on a neighbor's camera. This info is critical for helping the APD to narrow the review of the license plate reader database. If you are lucky, the license plate number for the suspect vehicle can be identified here.

### PUBLIC WORKSHOP KEY THEMES

#### Land Use and Design

#### **Beltline Subarea 6 Public Meeting**

Atlanta BeltLine, Inc. (ABI) presented its findings from the design workshops they hosted in May regarding the Subarea 6 Master Plan update of the Northeast Trail - which affects Morningside/Lenox Park - at their third public meeting on August 18. You can view the presentation here. They also reviewed the draft master plan goals and received feedback on the draft recommendations for land use (e.g. mixed use, housing, commercial services), mobility (trails, sidewalks, bikes, transit), parks and greenspace. There is an upcoming meeting on September 20 to share more about the progress being made to advance the Northeast Trail. This meeting will provide updates on the design efforts of segments 1 and 3 and construction progress for segment 2. Click here to register for this virtual meeting.



#### **Cheshire Bridge Update**

This latest construction activities for the rebuild of Cheshire Bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek were shared on September 9. The projected opening of at least one lane of traffic in each direction remains by October 31, 2022.

- Crews poured concrete footings at the base of the bridge and have laid the beams across the bridge footings. A total of 8 beams were installed on span #2. Crews will now work along the shore walls.
- Sewer line replacement is underway at the northwest corner of the bridge.
- Utility work is being finalized for the remaining companies.

#### A significant update from District 6 City Councilmember Alex Wan:

On Friday, September 9, I joined the Atlanta Department of Transportation (ADOT) Interim Commissioner Marsha Anderson Bomar at the construction site of the Cheshire Bridge replacement project. The work is progressing quickly, and the contractor is on track to have one lane open in each direction by the October 31 milestone. The remaining two lanes will follow quickly as the foundations/piers will already be in place, and I was told that we are now beyond the phase where weather, namely rain, could create any significant delays.

The new bridge will include bike lanes, and additional funding is included in the infrastructure bond approved by voters earlier this year to repave the entire stretch of Cheshire Bridge Road. I hope to have more details on the timing of that project when ADOT presents their implementation plan for the bond projects to Transportation Committee later this month.



**Updates on ATL Zoning 2.0.** The planned ATL 2.0 Zoning Rewrite Focused Workshop meetings have been cancelled, the first of which was scheduled for August 30, 2022, at Buckhead Library. We are close to completing the search for a new Commissioner, and our Interim Commissioner has had to take a short leave of absence for personal reasons. We want to ensure leadership is in place for this important engagement and participation with the community that will meet our shared goals for the City of Atlanta.
