## **President's Note**

2023 marks the centennial anniversary of the founding of Morningside/Lenox Park. In 1923, James R. Smith and M.S. Rankin built eight homes on E. Morningside Dr, creating a "suburban" model for Atlanta featuring 40-foot wide streets to accommodate the new obsession ... the automobile. During the 1920's, the first shopping center on Piedmont Rd and Wilson Park at the intersection of E. Morningside and N. Rock Springs were built. Morningside Elementary School's six room schoolhouse was founded in 1929. Over this next year, we will highlight memorable milestones for each of the previous decades.

As the new president of the Morningside Lenox Park Association, I am honored to follow in the footsteps of the first group of Morningside residents who, in 1965, incorporated the organization; and along with adjacent neighborhoods, waged a fight with the state over plans to build Interstate 485 directly through our beautiful area. In 1973, the state dropped its plan for the highway but the members of the MLPA board did not drop their mandate to use its influence for the betterment of all those living within its borders.

My overwhelming message to all the residents reading this newsletter each month is....WE cannot do it without YOU!! There is power in numbers and being a member of this voluntary organization makes security patrols, park improvements, community events, and most importantly having a voice in policy at the city government all possible.

Our goals for the 2023 centennial celebration of Morningside/Lenox Park are more community engagement through increased membership (join/renew) and volunteer hours, significant infrastructure improvements across the neighborhood, increased security through patrols and community awareness, and events designed to bring us all together and celebrate the uniqueness that is our shared experience in the greatest intown neighborhood Atlanta has to offer.

As you know, Coldwell Banker is vacating the property at 1370 N Highland, and Savi Provisions (a specialty food store) is interested in this space. In late December, members of the MLPA Board of Directors met with the Savi owners, who seemed eager to be in the neighborhood and willing to work with us. We learned several new things about their plans, including:

- possibly a deck on the side of the building
- an 800 square-foot room for the sale of liquor
- · a wine and cocktail dispensing machine for tastings--Italian model
- possible hours to 11pm

As noted in previous communications:

- Savi is by all accounts a respectful and law-abiding neighbor currently open in other metro locations (www.saviprovisions.com)
- We expect the current co-tenant, Professional Dry Cleaners to stay in place.
- In other locations, Savi operates 7am-9pm M-Th, 8am-10pm Fri-Sat, 8am-9pm Sun. Professional Dry Cleaners operates 8am-6pm M-Fr, 9am-5pm Sat. Alons operates 7am-8pm M-Sat, 9am-4pm Sun.
- Although not necessarily guaranteed or problematic, this new tenant could drive more foot and car traffic, noise and lighting compared to other nearby businesses.



## **ATL Zoning 2.0**

Help us write a new code for "ATL Zoning 2.0!" The City of Atlanta is rewriting its 40-year-old Zoning Ordinance that no longer meets Atlanta's present and future needs.

Join this important conversation on **Tuesday**, **January 17<sup>th</sup>**, **2023 at 6:30 p.m.** inside the <u>Russell Innovation Center for Entrepreneurs</u> (or R.I.C.E.) in Southwest Atlanta or virtually on <u>Zoom</u>. This is a Citywide conversation, and all Atlanta stakeholders are encouraged to participate.

In this meeting participants will have the opportunity to engage in a presentation on zoning concepts like the amount of car and bike parking required, use standards (such as for drive-throughs), site standards, and more. Participants will have time to ask questions and receive live answers. A workshop breakout will follow the presentation.

Each Zoning Workshop is designed to build upon information from the last workshop. The Zoning 2.0 series is designed to explore new zoning approaches and alternatives

that were identified in the 2016 Zoning Ordinance Diagnostic Report.

# Sunken Garden and Lenox-Wildwood Parks

The Friends of Sunken Garden and Lenox-Wildwood Parks are excited for the installation of two new park kiosks, which occurred on December 31, 2022. It was a happy New Year's Eve, indeed!

Park kiosks serve a multitude of purposes. They formalize the park and welcome visitors. They provide a space to educate, communicate, provide maps and other important information to community members. Sunken Garden and Lenox-Wildwood were our neighborhood's only recreational greenspaces without kiosks. Sunken Garden features a playground and field. Lenox-Wildwood features tennis/pickleball courts and meadows. Both parks are connected by a forested nature trail, which remains unknown to much of the community. Kiosks with maps and other information will help activate safe usage of these underutilized public spaces.

The kiosks for Sunken Garden Park and Lenox-Wildwood Park were largely funded by an award from last year's NPU-F Community Impact Grant. The MLPA contributed to the kiosk installations, as well, which were constructed by Kelly Crow, the Go To Guy. Many thanks to Kelly and his crew - who typically build decks, porches and outdoor living spaces - for not only their donation of materials, but also for their patience and flexibility throughout the permitting process!



# Sidney Marcus Park

What a year for our park in 2022! Upon completing the renovation of the park, our Friends of Sidney Marcus Park saw countless birthday parties, scouting events, church events, and community events, on a backdrop of fall concerts. It was a rebound from a rough 2 years of Covid uncertainty and real suffering on all fronts. But despite all of our obstacles and roadblocks, we had a terrific year at the park. Let us close 2022 with a "newsletter" of all that went on and what to expect in 2023 and beyond.

## **Ribbon Cutting on New Lower Park Area**

• Our 2020 Legacy Grant spent almost a year incubating while we waited on the building permits. With an end of 2021 start, Patrick Hand and his team from Integrated Land Design began their terrific work and we finally celebrated this important renovation with a ribbon cutting ceremony on April 29, 2022. Thank you Patrick for your innovative and creative interpretation of our Vision Plan for the park. With support from Park Pride, ATL Department of Parks and Recreation, Integrated Land Design, the MLPA, and our everstronger Friends of Sidney Marcus Park, this work capped off three matching funds, Park Pride grants, and community contributions of \$150,000.

## **Carving Colin**

• Our Friends of Sidney Marcus Park and neighbors continue to help in so many ways at the park. Our neighbor, Chris Vale, suggested we contact his brother, Colin Vale, in Maryland (<u>carvingcolin.com</u>), a wood carver and fantastic artist. Thanks to a substantial discount from Colin, we were able to contract Colin. He came down in absolutely the hottest part of the summer, and spent 3 weeks in Atlanta, creating a beautiful tribute to the Tulip Poplar and delivering a bench like no other. John Hults, directly across from the park on Sherwood Road, had a diseased poplar cut down. The masterful work of Boutte Tree Service was able to deliver a 9 foot slice of the tree over the power lines and directly into Sidney Marcus Park. Once again, Patrick and his team found a perfect spot for it and built a pad for what would be our new bench. With a celebratory "un-Vale-ing" of the bench in July, we definitely found our cherry-on-the-top for our renovation of the park.

## **Booster Campaign**

• Boosters do work! We had 10 blank pavers left in our new tribute area and ran a booster campaign to get tribute contributions. And we did! Not only did we add 10 new tribute pavers to the area, we got donations for two double pavers from the Marcus family. Sidney Marcus' sister and husband, Sandra and Gary Silver, added a double paver. And Sidney Marcus' son and wife, Brad and Pam Marcus, added a second double paver. The FSMP capital campaign was a complete success!

## **Food Drives at the Park**

- Our quarterly Food Drive at the Park tradition delivered strong dividends in 2022. We
  delivered 2,320 pounds of food and personal hygiene products to our partner, Intown
  Collaborative Ministries. Our neighborhood has a truly strong sense of giving and helping
  both with our park improvements and our food drives.
- Friday and Saturday, February 10 and 11, we will hold our first food drive of 2023 at the
  park. We will be collecting donations from 9am to 11am on Friday and Saturday at the
  entrance on Cumberland Road. Guidance on what is most needed is available on
  the Intown Collaborative Ministries website.

## **New Picnic Tables**

Once again, Larry Hogan, a neighbor and true Friend of Sidney Marcus Park, has
renovated our moveable picnic tables and they are better than new! If you have been to
the park recently, you have seen them. They are terrific and a good example of how
FSMP providing materials and neighborhood volunteers, like Larry, can make a huge
difference at the park. Our ability to support the number one group activity at the park, the
birthday party, continues to get stronger.

## **Preserving our Wood Structures**

 Another example of FSMP driven improvements and volunteers, we were able to paint the serpentine walkway, the carved bench and the new swing with a wood preservative.
 Thanks to Mlke Collins, John Hults and John Pappas for many volunteer hours, cleaning and coating our new wood structures.

## **Bond Referendum**

 Back in May, the city passed a green space bond referendum that has money earmarked for Sidney Marcus Park. We are working with Councilman Wan to continue to build out our Vision Plan and hopefully use these funds to complete another large renovation of the park. We are not sure how, yet, this project will go, but we have the opportunity to pretty much finish the park, focusing on the upper half of the park. And the better news is there is money in this bond for Sunken Garden Park and our two nature preserves. There have been so many exciting things that happened in 2022. In addition to strong focused efforts at our parks and nature preserves, there is broader and better coordinated support for our greenspaces across Morningside. Thanks to a great volunteer effort by Micah Colemen and Holly Sassnett and strong support from the MLPA, we are coordinating our efforts and channeling our energy on the neighborhood's biggest asset, our greenspaces.




# **Puzzle Competition**
