The Monroe Complete Street infrastructure project, in addition to roundabout installation at Lenox/Johnson and roundabout improvements at Pelham/Rock Springs/Wildwood, are scheduled to begin in the near future. Additional thanks to Alex Wan for his continued work on alcohol code reform and short-term rental property regulations.

And a huge thank you to Betsy at <u>Casseroles</u> in the Morningside Village for her kindness in providing amazing food for the board during our annual planning meeting. Sidewalk Reimbursement Program

Announcing the 2023 MLPA Sidewalk Reimbursement Program

The MLPA conducted a neighborhood survey some time ago to determine the interest and need for a sidewalk renewal program and - not surprisingly - the need is high!

To help subsidize renovation costs and incentivize homeowners, we've created a program to reimburse homeowners up to \$400 for costs associated with any sidewalk repair or replacement!

Why should homeowners repair and/or replace an old sidewalk?

Homeowners often assume the City of Atlanta is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their sidewalks and, in some instances, the City of Atlanta may pay for sidewalk repairs to comply with ADA requirements.

If your sidewalk is not subject to ADA compliance, maintenance and repair are the responsibility of the homeowner and the homeowner can potentially be held liable for injury resulting from poorly maintained property in the public domain.

Maintaining our sidewalks is important for the safety of all and for maintaining the overall enjoyment and beauty of our neighborhood. In fact, walkability is often cited as a primary attribute new homeowners look for when buying a new home, and for this reason, Morningside/Lenox Park is one of Atlanta's most desirable neighborhoods in the city!

Clarification to the Article "Do You Want Security Cameras On Your Street?"

Commentary from readers suggested that the article about license plate reader (LPR) cameras in the February 1 Morningside Security Report needed clarification. The questions posed in the article were intended for neighbors who were considering the rental or purchase of cameras for installation on their block or street*. There are numerous camera models with different capabilities on the market. The purchase or rental, installation, maintenance, and location of these cameras would be at the discretion of the neighbors, without input from the Atlanta Police Department (APD).

In contrast, over the past several years, the MLPA worked with the APD to locate eight LPRs on through streets and entrance streets in the neighborhood. These locations were all approved by the APD and are placed where they will have maximal utility as part of the City-wide network of cameras. As such, these cameras are maintained by the City.

*These are not cameras installed by the front door of their house.

Atlanta Public Schools Updates

New Pre-K Site at Future Virginia-Highland Elementary

One pre-kindergarten classroom, with a capacity for 22 students, will open at the new Virginia-Highland Elementary school next year. A list of all APS pre-kindergarten sites can be found <a href="https://nee.ncb.nlm.nee.nc

High School Overcapacity Issues

APS has kicked off a new annual process to review school capacity, with a focus on overcrowded schools at the high school level. View this <u>short video</u> to learn where APS has been and where APS is going in the high school capacity conversation. You can also view the slide deck <u>here</u>.

Important Takeaways:

- Established a guarantee: No rezoning in the 2023-24 school year
- Implemented a new transparent and clear annual review process which includes administrative and district considerations at every level; not just rezoning
- Regarded ideas from the focus groups that were broader than just capacity, departments continued exploration and identification of actions aligned to our equity commitments and other strategic priorities (examples: expanded access to rigor, extracurriculars, etc.)

The district's first annual capacity review process meeting took place on Wednesday, February 15:

- Recording: Annual Review Process Kickoff Meeting
- Presentation: Annual Review Process Presentation

Future information, including redistricting if necessary, will be shared <u>here</u>.

The next engagement to discuss soon-to-be-created scenarios addressing capacity at Midtown High will be held on March 9 at noon (virtual) and at 6:00pm (Morningside @ Inman Auditorium, 774 Virginia Ave.)

MARTA Clifton Corridor Update

MARTA is advancing bus rapid transit (BRT) - instead of light rail transit (LRT) - for the Clifton Corridor to connect the Lindbergh and Avondale Estates rail stations. This line will run just north alongside Morningside/Lenox Park with proposed stops on Cheshire Bridge Rd and at Sage Hill/Briarcliff.

BRT will provide a high-capacity transit connection between two existing heavy rail lines. The project could connect the Lindbergh Center Station to the Decatur or Avondale Stations along a rapidly developing residential, institutional, and mixed-use corridor. Key destinations include Emory University, Emory University Hospital, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Children's Healthcare of Atlanta - Egleston, and Atlanta VA Medical Center. Lenox-Wildwood Bridge

The new bridge installation that will connect both meadows in the northern section of the park, link the Morningside Nature Trail across Berkshire Rd and provide a safe, level path between the playground and the tennis courts has been approved by the city's Zoning, Buildings, Structural and Arborist departments. As the final permit is acquired from Site Development to complete the necessary approvals, we'll be ready to proceed. We are hopeful that installation will be completed in March (or April). Thanks again for your patience!

Sunken Garden Visioning

We are excited to receive a vision plan for park improvement projects at Sunken Garden and look forward to sharing that with you soon. This plan coincides with the allocation of \$300,000 to Sunken Garden from the Infrastructure Bond that was passed last year. Much appreciation to Ben Nemo for taking the lead on this effort!

We've created a wish list to support the firefighters who serve our community every single day. We hope you'll consider a donation to Station 19. See the wish list here.




