#### **President's Note**

Atlanta is affectionately known as a "city in the forest." Surrounding the buildings and homes stand giant trees and other types of plant life that envelop much of the man-made infrastructure. This gives the city of Atlanta a very different look from many other major cities across the country.

That's the good part. The bad part is as a result of climate change, allergy season is reported to be a full month longer than 30 years ago. Even that fact has not deterred the Morningside community from getting out and enjoying the Concerts in the Park and lending their time to various Friends of the Parks groups - including Morningside Elementary's Dolphins Do Good group, which participated in an archeology and nature walk at Herbert Taylor/Daniel Johnson Parks. In addition, the Friends of Sidney Marcus collected more than 600 pounds of food and personal hygiene products at their quarterly drive!

Next up is the final Concert in the Park on May 19 at 6:00pm in Sidney Marcus Park, followed by the celebration of the opening of the beautiful new bridge at Lenox-Wildwood Park on Saturday May 20 at 9:30am. More details below for both events.

A huge thank you goes out to all the Morningside and surrounding neighbors who rallied resoundingly to the threat of more adult businesses on Cheshire Bridge Rd. More than 1,900 signatures on the petition (circulated under the leadership of Ryan Howard) and over 100 individual emails to the City demonstrate how important a unified voice is in protecting our neighborhood; however, the fight is not over. Please continue to share the petition to increase our voice and use this opportunity to join MLPA, so we will have the resources both financially and with volunteers to continue advocating for a neighborhood that reflects the residents who live here.

Big plans are in the works for the Beltline, as well as the Amsterdam Walk project. Continue reading to review the plans for the Beltline Subarea 6 and submit your comments or suggestions before the end of June when public comment closes. Also join the developers of the potential Amsterdam Walk project for a presentation on Tuesday, May 16 from 6:30 - 8:00pm (again, more information below) - remember you will have to preregister to attend.

Finally, our sympathy to anyone affected by the senseless gun violence that affected our community in early May. As a result of License Plate Reading (LPR) cameras throughout the city, the criminal was apprehended. Our dedication to security is paramount and we at MLPA, in partnership with Alex Wan on the City Council, will be purchasing at least two new LPR cameras to bring our total coverage to 10. ## **Beltline Subarea 6 Master Plan Updates and Community Engagement**

The Atlanta Beltline is coming to Morningside! Or perhaps mostly Morningside-adjacent is more accurate. While the trail will only brush our neighborhood, the <u>Subarea 6 Master Plan</u> envisions redevelopment and improvements for a wide swath around the Beltline itself, including public art

land use, and parks and open spaces. That plan was from 2011. Now the Atlanta Beltline is recommending master plan updates to address changes in land use, zoning, mobility, and other discrepancies throughout the subarea.

#### **Purpose & Outcomes**

- To build on the foundation of the 2011 Master Plan by documenting changes since adoption.
- To provide recommendations to guide growth and development for vibrant, livable mixeduse communities in the area of transit-oriented development (land use/zoning), mobility, affordable housing, green space, etc.

#### **Draft Land Use Recommendations Include:**

- Ansley Mall @ Piedmont & Monroe Intersection
- Ansley Square @ Piedmont & Monroe Intersection
- Piedmont Park Expansion
- Kroger @ Monroe Drive
- North Piedmont Heights @ Gables
- 10th and Virginia Avenue
- Amsterdam Walk at the BeltLine
- Dutch Valley Road
- Ponce De Leon at the BeltLine
- Ponce De Leon at Ponce De Leon Place (NE Corner)
- Ponce De Leon Place at Maiden Lane

Please review all of the draft recommendations in this presentation (especially our Morningside park and green space lovers). **The Subarea 6 Project Team is soliciting public input through June 30.** Provide feedback here. #### weeting a worningside ireasure

At the Morningside Farmers Market's "Greens, Eggs, and Jam," the MLPA was there to help celebrate the start of spring, speak with neighbors and meet new ones. Imagine our surprise and excitement when one woman stopped by our table to say hello, and we learned that she was not only a former MLPA President (elected in September 1972) but also a member of the Atlanta City Council for 20 years (from 1978-1998). And that's not all. This steadfast neighbor was one of the leading activists who stopped powerful entities from building a highway straight through the middle of Morningside. She is Mary Davis!

How fortuitous that during our neighborhood's centennial year, it is also the 50th anniversary of when five Morningside women (along with some friends) won a major battle that halted I-485, a six-lane freeway, from devastating our and several other intown communities. If you are not already familiar with or would like a refresher of this monumental crisis, we strongly recommend you take the time to read this comprehensive 30th Anniversary Retrospective: The Interstate That Almost Was from 2003.

The dramatic story "involves mayors, governors, state and federal bureaucrats, two civic associations both claiming to represent the neighborhood, the defeat of almost an entire city council, and the election of a new mayor. The fight to stop the highway not only obliterated I-485; it helped bring into existence a new way of governing the city and a new power for local city neighborhoods, a power they continue to wield today." It is a truly remarkable and significant part of our neighborhood's history.

### **Herbert Taylor and Daniel Johnson Parks**

Literal showers (more than 4 inches!) canceled the bird walk—even so, they have been out in the parks enjoying the fruits of volunteer labor. Work in April focused on the Johnson Road entrance, with ivy, porcelain berry, and Chinese wisteria cut from the tree canopy. This protects the forest and all its visitors.

Thanks to our friends from Emory Alumni Association's Emory Cares who came out to celebrate Earth Day a bit early. Their efforts, and that of our friend from the Georgia Forestry Commission, David Long, freed at least a half dozen trees that were inundated by invasive vines.

John Mayes and Ansley Abraham led the archaeology walk on April 22. Neighbors and parents/children with the Morningside Elementary Dolphins Do Good learned about the native owners of our land. After a brief showing of a portion of their collections, we walked to the beach where we cleaned up trash and even discovered one pottery shard!

Spring leads to summer quickly in Atlanta. In order to keep up with the good work volunteers have done over the past, we're scheduling TWO workdays and hope to see many of you out to help us at least once:

- Saturday, May 13, 9:00 AM Noon—Celebrate Mother's Day early by helping mother
  nature in the park. We will continue to work on removing the last vestiges of Japanese
  Chaff Flower from the trails. We will also tackle some of the trees that are covered with ivy
  so that they can continue to support our gorgeous tree canopy!
- Tuesday, May 23, 9:00 AM Noon—Since Saturday doesn't work for everyone, we hope
  to expand our efforts with a weekday gathering. Meet at the kiosk and we will split into
  groups to remove invasive species and install native plants.

Bring your own garden gloves and tools or borrow ours. Bring water to drink, sunscreen, and bug spray. Wear long sleeves, pants, & close toed shoes—poison ivy has been seen. Meet at the kiosk at 1343 Pasadena Ave for a short introduction & safety briefing. #### **Morningside Nature Preserve**

Help promote a healthy plant community and a sustainable forest in Morningside Nature Preserve. Your work will improve habitat for humans who use the greenspace for recreation and wildlife that call it home. Trees Atlanta is resuming their monthly volunteer workdays, **now on the third Saturday of each month**. Activities include hand-pulling and cutting invasive plants such as English ivy, Chinese privet, and kudzu in a densely wooded area off trail. Physical activity such as bending, pulling, lifting, and kneeling is required. Forest restoration can be physically strenuous - be ready to break a sweat and get dirty and learn a lot while doing it! #### MARTA Introduces Breeze 2.0 Pay-by-Phone App

The Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) launches the new **Breeze Mobile 2.0** app, an updated way to pay for your ride with your smartphone. This new app was designed to address customer feedback during the testing of Breeze Mobile 1.0 and delivers new features to make paying fares easier. Customers may still use other Breeze fare media, including Breeze cards and tickets.

"One of the most common customer requests is a way to conveniently pay for each ride as you go, rather than having to load a card or stand in line to buy a ticket at the ticket machines," said MARTA Chief Customer Experience Officer Rhonda Allen. "This updated **Breeze Mobile 2.0** app lets you pay-as-you-go. Just scan your phone on the bus or at the faregate and you're on your way."

In addition to purchasing tickets and products on the updated app, MARTAriders can load stored value to their **Breeze Mobile 2.0** account, allowing the app to work just like a Breeze card.

#### **HOW TO DOWNLOAD:**

Open your app store and search for Breeze Mobile 2.0:

- App Store: Breeze Mobile 2 on the App Store (apple.com)
- Google Play store: Breeze Mobile 2 Apps on Google Play

Download and create a new account. Since **Breeze Mobile 2.0** is a new app, everyone will need to create an account. even users of the previous Breeze Mobile 1.0 app.
