It has been a hectic and productive first half of the year, with ongoing discussions still underway regarding Amsterdam Walk, the Streetcar extension, license plate reading cameras, a partnership with Atlanta Botanical Garden for our smaller park spaces, and opposition to new adult businesses on Cheshire Bridge Road - just to name a few - so please make sure and join us every second Monday of the month at 7pm for our board meeting via Zoom where you can have your voice heard and hear input from others in the neighborhood. As much as I have stressed the importance of membership for a successful organization like ours, we still have not achieved the level of participation one would expect from such a vibrant, active community. A few of the most impactful traffic and safety wins over the last few months include the all-way stops added to a few dangerous intersections. Be on the lookout for more of these improvements including plans for all-way stops at Johnson Rd/Meadowdale and E Sussex/Berkshire, as well as enhanced crosswalks near the Johnson Rd. entrance to Herbert Taylor/Daniel Johnson and the Lenox Rd parking lot at Morningside Nature Preserve, in addition to one planned for Morningside Village between Family Dog and Nowak's. Keep reading for additional information from our Traffic-Calming Committee and Master Plan Implementation team

Finally, the sidewalk repair program is in full swing and waiting on residents to take advantage of it. <u>Click here</u> for more information. Interest in this program will determine how long it remains a budget item for MLPA.




Spring Concert Series Recap

Traffic-Calming Measures

This year, the Traffic-Calming Committee (TCC) and the Master Plan Implementation Committee (MPIC) began functioning as one team, to continue working on planned projects as designated in our <u>Master Plan</u> and to decide on new traffic-calming projects. This hard-working team of dedicated volunteers, led by Camille Richardson, has some beneficial updates to share.

Stop Signs:

- Two new stop signs have been legislated, and we are hoping to see them approved soon.
 - E Sussex x E Rock Springs (near Morningside Elementary and Haygood UMC)
 - o Johnson Rd x Meadowdale (near Briarcliff Rd)
- Stop signs at *E Sussex x Berkshire* were legislated last year, but we are waiting for an update on installation.

Pedestrian Crosswalks:

- Two pedestrian crosswalks were legislated for Lenox Rd.
 - Near the bridge over South Fork Peachtree Creek (installed)
 - Near the Morningside Nature Preserve parking lot
- One pedestrian crosswalk on N Highland Ave between Nowak's and Family Dog.
 - This crosswalk was also legislated last year, and we are waiting for an update on installation.

Amsterdam Walk Potential Redevelopment Community Meeting





Centennial Historical Timeline: The 1960s

The 1960s: Morningside Fights I485 Construction

As part of our centennial year observance, we have been reaching out to neighbors and friends to collect old photos, newspaper clippings, maps, and official letters and documents to include on our <u>Centennial Timeline</u>. We are so appreciative of the wonderful and interesting materials received to date. When you go to the website to view the timeline, be sure to click on 'Continue Reading' to see more photos and information about each decade.

We have just added 'The 1960s,' which focuses solely on the initial response of the neighborhood to the announcement by the Georgia State Highway Department in 1964 to construct Interstate 485 through the center of the neighborhood. The Morningside Lenox Park Association (MLPA) was formed in response to this announcement to fight these plans and specifically Route B, shown on the map above. The MLPA hired a traffic consultant to consider alternative routes, which included Route E, located further west along Piedmont and Monroe. Read more about this history—the formation of a second neighborhood association, the first suit filed against the Highway Department, and denial of the legal action.



In 1969, the Georgia State Highway Department located a temporary office on E Rock Springs Road to facilitate the condemnation and tearing down of residential properties.

Next month, we will bring you the 1970s decade, when five industrious and determined activist women in the neighborhood played a major role in stopping the construction of the highway. We view the timeline as "a living document" that can be updated as we find new materials. If you have some historical documents or photos that may be interesting to include, please send along to Phyllis Wingo at security@mlpa.org. We do not have much info for the 1940s and 1950s. If you have corrections to offer, please send those along as well.

We plan on bringing a new decade to you each month this year. We will also create a folder of the many photos provided but not included on the Timeline. Stay tuned!

Members have asked and/or received anything and everything under the sun - whether it's clothes, books, housewares, plants, furniture, toys, outdoor equipment, food, you name it! Ask and you'll most likely receive, or discover items you didn't even know you needed (or that you've been wanting to get but just didn't).

Last weekend, the online community held its first in-person event at Sidney Marcus Park! The Swap Meet was quite a success, with members donating their goods and then all invited to "shop" (for free, of course) and meet each other face-to-face. Lenox-Wildwood Park

Herbert Taylor and Daniel Johnson Parks

While Memorial Day weekend didn't feel like the start of summer, it is nevertheless! Take some time to stroll through the park to see the results of this winter's/spring's intensive labor to remove invasive species. We still have work to do, but you should see evidence of the fruits of our habitat restoration efforts.

A small but energetic group of volunteers worked in the park in May. Thanks to them for clearing ivy off some of the champion trees. This summer we will experiment with cutting the ivy back on the forest floor in hopes that we can encourage native plants like our jack-in-the-pulpit (*Arisaema triphyllum*).

The summer brings a lot of greenery, but one flowering shrub that stands out is Smooth hydrangea (*Hydrangea arborescens*). Friends of Herbert Taylor Park & Daniel Johnson Park used a grant from NPU-F and Atlanta City Planning to install several near the kiosk. Another plant installed with the NPU-F grant, also on Beech Valley, is Bottlebrush buckeye (*Aeculus parviflora*), with its distinctive buckeyes.

Join us on **Saturday**, **July 8**, **9:00 AM - Noon** for our next workday. Bring your own garden gloves and tools or borrow ours. Bring water to drink, sunscreen, and bug spray. Wear long sleeves, pants, & close toed shoes—poison ivy has been seen. Meet at the kiosk at 1343 Pasadena Ave for a short introduction & safety briefing. Morningside Nature Preserve

Help promote a healthy plant community and a sustainable forest in Morningside Nature Preserve. Your work will improve habitat for humans who use the greenspace for recreation and wildlife that call it home. Trees Atlanta is resuming their monthly volunteer workdays, **now on the third Saturday of each month**. Activities include hand-pulling and cutting invasive plants such as English ivy, Chinese privet, and kudzu in a densely wooded area off trail. Physical activity such as bending, pulling, lifting, and kneeling is required. Forest restoration can be physically strenuous - be ready to break a sweat and get dirty and learn a lot while doing it! Zoning

One zoning case was heard this month by the Zoning Committee, for 1386 Wayne Ave. It has been deferred until next month.

Any neighbors interested in variance outcomes should come to these meetings. All neighbors are welcome to attend; come to three meetings to qualify to vote. For more information, contact our MLPA Zoning Chair Rebekah Falkler at zoning@mlpa.org.



As of April 13, 2023, all permitted projects approved by the arborist require a pre-construction inspection before beginning any construction activity. **Section 158-106.**

PRE-INSPECTION STEPS:

- 1. Each final approved construction plan receives approval sticker from arborist plan reviewer (see below).
- 2. Permit is issued.
- 3. Tree protection fence is installed by developer/builder according to the approved arborist stamped plans.
- 4. Applicant schedules inspection (404)-658-6800 per arborist approval guidelines. Preconstruction code: 513.
- 5. Inspection is scheduled. Completed by field arborist within 2 business days.
- 6. Inspection results in pass or fail. Failed inspections: corrections must be completed, and another inspection request should be submitted.
- 7. Passed inspections: construction approved to begin.



Alcohol License Permitting

There were no alcohol license permit applications discussed at this month's MLPA meeting.

Establishments are not required to come before nor seek approval from neighborhood associations before they seek approval at the NPU. The NPU makes a recommendation on the application to the License Review Board (LRB), and then the LRB makes a recommendation to the Mayor (who has final say). Questions?
