President's Note

I hope everyone enjoyed a beautiful Labor Day weekend. There's nothing better than spending a few extra days with family and friends and enjoying all that our city has to offer.

If you were out and about you may have noticed the construction activity at the old Coldwell Banker location. After nine months of planning and negotiations with the neighborhood, Savi Provisions is set to

open a branch of their store in early 2024. Our voices were heard and this location will follow the same model as their Inman Park store with specialty foods and off-premises beer and wine only.

Let's continue to support all of the businesses in Morningside Village that make our neighborhood unique and vibrant, including Whiskey Bird where a fundraising event for LPR security cameras was held resulting in more than \$500 being donated. The next LPR security event will be October 23 and 24 at another of our MLPA supportive businesses, Doc Chey's. Remember to mention MLPA when you dine there (or carry out) during this time frame for a portion of your money to benefit the campaign to bring additional LPR cameras to the neighborhood. Nearly \$5800 has been collected thus far and you can continue to add to the total by clicking here.

On a more serious note, thank you to Robin Deutsch Edwards and Howie Slomka for an enlightening presentation and action plan regarding remaining historical racial exclusions from the 1940's on some developments within the Morningside neighborhood. (In their case, the Hylan Park development - which encompasses all of lower Zimmer Drive and lower Reeder Circle - 'below' Bonnie Lane) While these types of exclusions were ruled to be illegal and unenforceable by state and federal courts in the years following their adoption, they still remain "on the books" in some areas. Removing these restrictions has become a mission for our two passionate Morningside residents, who have offered to help anyone who finds such antiquated, offensive exclusionary language in their own developments.

The Beltline expansion northeast trail section between Piedmont and 10th and Monroe has begun. The carriage path has been blocked off for construction and will replace the existing gravel path that currently serves to connect that section of the Beltline that runs through Piedmont Park. Once this is finished, the Monroe Complete Streets Project will begin with a raised intersection at 10th and Monroe. By next fall, the Monroe Street Diet will move north toward our neighborhood. Our MLPA Master Plan Implementation (MPI) Committee has been working with our City Councilmember Alex Wan on traffic mitigation on the surrounding streets. Please reach out to our MPI Chair, Camille Richardson, with any questions.

The countdown is on for the highly anticipated Centennial Celebration at Callanwolde Fine Arts Center on November 10! Ticket sales over the past month has been brisk and this event is sure to sell out soon, so make your plans to join us for an amazing evening. And for the entire family, the Centennial Family Bash on October 20 is sure to be the best version of Concerts in the Park ever at Sidney Marcus Park.

With the last weeks of summer approaching, more centennial events are kicking into high gear:

- The next Concert in the Park will be Friday, September 22 so if you have not made it out to Sidney Marcus Park yet, this is your chance. Hopefully the temperatures will be more moderate and a great evening to meet neighbors, celebrate the arrival of Fall and listen to a great band will be enjoyed.

These LPR cameras, which are made by Flock Security, help the Atlanta Police Department (APD) track vehicles suspected of being involved in crimes from camera-to-camera across neighborhoods. Officers are able to view camera footage and get updates on vehicle locations in their patrol cars. Officers on patrol nearby to cameras where suspect vehicles are seen can stop the vehicles to investigate. For more information, see our website.

Centennial Timeline - The 1970s

As part of our centennial year observance, we have been reaching out to neighbors and friends to collect old photos, newspaper clippings, maps, and official letters and documents to include on our **Centennial Timeline**. We are so appreciative of the wonderful and interesting materials received to date. 
We have just added 'The 1970s', which focuses primarily on the efforts of five women road warriors to stop the construction of i-485 through the center of the neighborhood. In February 1971, concerned Morningside residents Mary Davis, Virginia Gaddis, Adele Northrup, Barbara Ray, Virginia Taylor and others formed a Political Action Committee (PAC). "Our first problem was to convince the neighborhood that the highway could be stopped" (Barbara Ray). "Our other battle was to stop the state from tearing down houses" (Mary Davis). Since 1966, the state had acquired 1007 properties (many were boarded up) and torn down about 300 houses. The Georgia Highway Department set up an office on E Rock Springs Road and pressured homeowners to sell and get out.

Also, by the mid-1970s, enrollment at Morningside Elementary School had dropped into the 120s. In 1973, under the Atlanta Compromise, Morningside Elementary School was paired with C. W. Hill Elementary School (now Hope Hill) in Bedford Pines for busing in a step toward ending racial segregation in the Atlanta Public Schools. Before the Compromise, 100% of Morningside students were white, and 99% of C.W. Hill students were black. According to the Compromise, the plan for each grade was as follows:

- Kindergarten: children attended the school in their neighborhood
- Grades 1-3: children from Morningside were bused to C.W. Hill in Bedford-Pines
- Grades 4-6: children from C.W. Hill were bused to Morningside Elementary.

We view the timeline as "a living document" that can be updated as we find new materials. If you have some historical documents or photos that may be interesting to include, please send along to Phyllis Wingo at security@mlpa.org. We do not have much info for the 1940s and 1950s. If you have corrections to offer, please send those along as well.

We will also create a folder of the many photos provided but not included on the Timeline. Stay tuned!



Atlanta Metropolitan Transportation Plan Survey

The Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) is currently reviewing and updating the <u>Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP)</u>, the long-range blueprint that guides transportation investments in the Atlanta region through 2050. ARC anticipates an additional 1.8 million residents by 2050 in the twenty county region under its aegis.

The MTP Update will program about \$173 billion in federal, state, and local transportation funding through 2050. The plan ultimately aims to ease congestion, expand transit service, improve safety, provide alternative commute options, all while maintaining existing infrastructure.

ARC welcomes input from residents. You can get involved by taking a survey that they have created. Take the <u>MTP Survey</u>.



Lenox-Wildwood Park



Have you noticed the improvements being made at Herbert Taylor Park? As the photo above attests, the wildlife has! Join in the fun as we restore the habitat for our native flora and fauna:

Meet at the kiosk at 1343 Pasadena Ave for a short introduction & safety briefing.

The young buck pictured above was seen browsing vegetation along Rock Creek near the bridge. Volunteers have removed exotic species so that nutritious native plants can thrive and feed our birds and animals. You can help—simply show up for a session and learn from our team of experts. All you need to bring is personal water, bug spray, and sunscreen. We have gloves and tools you can borrow or you can bring your own. Wear long sleeves and pants for bug and poison ivy protection.

The City of Atlanta Department of Parks and Recreation invites you to join us for an upcoming Community Meeting to learn more about what is happening at DPR! Parks are growing, recreation programs are expanding, and we want you to know!

We are excited to demonstrate how we are working for you, showcase our new initiatives, and to learn more about how we can best serve our neighbors through exceptional parks & recreation services.

During the planning process for <u>Activate ATL</u>, our 10-Year Master Plan that was approved in December 2021, we heard from community, partners, and staff about the need to prioritize and fund equitable improvements; further elevating the need for additional resources to help us achieve our goals to Invest, Connect, and Grow Atlanta's Parks and Recreation System.

Thanks to each of you and our many partners, friends groups, conservancies, Mayor Andre Dickens, and City Council, we have delivered on our efforts to bring more resources to DPR with a recent Millage Funding increase which will provide DPR with an estimated \$16 million a year to continuously improve our services and offerings.






Centennial Ball - November 10

Do you know the difference between calling 911 and the 10-digit non-emergency number 404-658-6666? It is important to call the right number to ensure that you get the assistance you need.

- 911 is for emergencies where immediate response is required from police, fire or ambulance.
- 404-658-6666 is for urgent, but non-emergency matters such as car accidents without injuries or crimes where some time has passed and there is no longer a suspect on scene.

Knowing the correct number to dial and when helps keep 911 lines clear for true emergencies.
