




Volunteer Appreciation



Updated Walking Tour

The walk through Morningside-Lenox Park's history was originally written in the early 1990s. It was researched by MLPA stalwarts Pam & Jim Auchmutey, Bill Chalker, Mary Huntz, Don & Syd Janney, Betty Layng, David Robertson, Genevieve Scully, Kenneth H. Thomas, Jr. and Brian Randall for publication around the time of the Atlanta Olympic Games (1996).

The 2023 version was updated by Pam Auchmutey, Don Campbell, Debby Eason, Syd Janney, and Barb Tucker. Brian Randall designed the original map.

The entire walk is around six miles, but feel free to break it into sections. We suggest beginning at Smith Park, the neighborhood gateway, but begin wherever you would like. The important thing is to get out, enjoy our neighborhood and learn some of the background of the sites within our borders.

Public Right-of-Way Issues to Report

Road repaving and restriping, potholes, and sinkholes.

- Downed streetlights, street signs, and traffic lights.
- Damaged water drains, drain covers, and fire hydrants.
- Graffiti on bridges, road signs, and abandoned buildings.
- Overflowing trash and dumping.
- Broken/dangerous sidewalks and street obstructions.

What to Include in Your Report:

- Photo of issue
- Exact location: address, intersection or photo of pin on the map
- Description of the issue and impact.

Two Ways to Report:

- 1. Submit an issue directly to ATL311, then email us the information and case number.
- 2. Email us the issue and we'll report it.

After Thanksgiving, the weather turned cold, but that didn't stop us from making more progress as we freed trees along Beech Valley with a small but mighty crew of volunteers. Parks Maintenance

We lost another green ash along the bottomlands trail in November. Thanks to the City of Atlanta Department of Parks for getting a crew out to remove the downed tree and repair the trail.

Thanks to David Long, Georgia Forestry Commission, for consulting with Friends of Herbert Taylor Park to diagnose the problem causing so many trees to fall. The culprit is the Emerald Ash Borer, an invasive pest that is damaging green ash throughout Atlanta. There is little we can do to minimize the damage, other than continuing invasive plant removal to lower stress placed on the remaining trees.


Meet the Board: Sarah Chatel

Morningside Farmers' Market Special Updates

Morningside Farmers Market is your <u>year-round</u> (<u>Saturdays</u>, <u>8-11:30am</u>) neighborhood market.

Need tresh vegetables, meats, or breads for your holiday meals or New Years celebrations? Morningside Farmers Market will be open both Saturdays, Dec. 23rd and Dec. 30th. The market is one of few Atlanta markets open through the wintertime (January through March). Warm your hands with a steaming San Francisco Roasting Company coffee, grab a croissant from The Buttery ATL and shop local this winter!

Also, did you know that our farmers market has its roots in a co-op?

In the late 1980's, Cynthia Hizer started an herb garden at the old Atlanta Waterworks in the late 1980s. As her garden grew, so did new ideas, and in 1995, she joined forces with Ann Brewer to launch *Georgia Grown Organic Produce*, a co-op of 30 farmers to serve seasonal produce to local chefs.

The coop often had extra produce after making their restaurant rounds, so they started selling to the public. By the second week, it was so successful that the farmers wanted to start selling on their own, and the Morningside Farmers Market was born. Fast forward almost 30 years and a few of the same farmers are still with us alongside a newly forged group of farmers and artisans, all proud to be serving the community with the highest quality in fresh, local, and organic produce.

To run a market, it takes <u>co-op-eration!</u> Thank you for being an important part of our past and future to champion healthy eating, thriving farms and artisans, and most of all, a community of mutual cooperation.

Morningside Farmers Market has been offering certified organic produce, local meats, breads, and goods since 1995, every Saturday morning. Visit all of the vendors at their year-round home in the Morningside Presbyterian Church parking lot (1411 N. Morningside Drive NE). The market's location offers a spacious, tree-lined setting for neighbors to hang out from 8:00-11:30am.


