Amsterdam Walk

On Monday Anril 21 the full City Council will vote on Portman Holdings' applications to

rezone and redevelop Amsterdam Walk. The current proposal for Amsterdam Walk under review (Z-23-063 and CDP-23-026) is not the project we negotiated with Portman Holdings nor the plans that we approved.

At this time, we believe any proposed redevelopment at Amsterdam Walk should comply with the land use recommendation as described in the Atlanta Beltline Subarea 6 Master Plan*, originally adopted by City Council in December, 2011 and updated at the end of last year in December, 2024. The Subarea 6 Master Plan process included a robust stakeholder engagement program, which was a critical component of providing recommendations that will implement the future vision for the area. We trust the collective and comprehensive wisdom of the six neighborhood communities that created the Beltline Master Plan in collaboration with the staff of the Atlanta Beltline and their outside urban planning consultants.

As such, the MLPA Board approved and sent <u>this letter</u> urging council members to uphold the City's commitment to community engagement and small area planning as noted in the Comprehensive Development Plan, "Plan A."

*As stated in the Subarea 6 Master Plan on page 39: "Given Amsterdam Walk's proximity to the Beltline, Piedmont Park and the adjacent existing single-family residential area, the future land use proposed for this area is Low-Density Mixed-Use (1-4 stories) along the southern, eastern, and western edge and Medium-Density Mixed-Use (5-9 stories) at the interior of the development. This proposal will provide pedestrian scale type uses along the southern and western edge of the site."




MLPWay Implementation

MLPWay with planning consultant Aaron Fortner. The MLPWay refers to the bike and pedestrian network aimed at providing safe and slow streets to access each quadrant of the neighborhood.

Cheshire Bridge Court Cases

A Municipal Court hearing regarding Happy Hermans, European Dry Cleaners, and Landmark Diner on Cheshire Bridge Road will be held on **Tuesday, April 29, 2025, at 9:00 AM at the City of Atlanta Municipal Court**, 150 Garnett Street, Atlanta GA 30303, Court Room 5C.The case numbers are: 25CV000455, 25CV000455A, 25CV000461, 25CV000461A, 25CV000465, and 25CV000465A.

The judges often appreciate the presence of community members during these proceedings. The solicitor's office will be prosecuting code enforcement violations for these locations, which can either result in a trial or fines.

Congratulations to our very own, John Pappas, for all of his work at Sidney Marcus Park!


John believes that the ties between a park and its community are "double-knotted," with the community giving to the park and the park giving right back.

When John jumpstarted the Friends of Sidney Marcus Park in 2017, the Morningside park was overgrown and faced drainage challenges, but he could see that it was well-used and well-loved. While the park didn't have much to offer, John quickly realized that people care about their local park and that neighbors need places to gather.

John says that he knows the park is doing its job when he sees it filled with activity – whether it's birthday parties, Boy Scout meetings, concerts or local church celebrations.

John describes parks as pillars of our communities. This became abundantly clear during the pandemic when the Friends group began hosting quarterly food donation drives in the park in collaboration with a neighborhood food bank. The Piedmont Heights (PiHi) Alliance is thrilled to announce the second Beautify PiHi of 2025 on **Saturday, May 17 from 9:30-Noon**. Volunteers will be picking up trash from Faulkner to I-85 on Cheshire Bridge Road.

PiHi Alliance started Beautify PiHi in June of 2020 when the organization was less than one year old. They took their efforts to the streets to build community and give back to businesses, residents and customers by making commercial districts cleaner and more approachable. This has included cataloging over 70 ATL311 issues since 2020 and closing 50 tickets with completed work.

Morningside Farmers Market

This **Saturday, April 19**, the market will move to the small parking lot on the other side of the Morningside Presbyterian Church (access from Wessyngton Road).

The Morningside Farmers Market has you covered with all their farmers and producers. On any given Saturday, you might find: produce and flowers, pastured pork, beef, and freshly milled grains, mushrooms, prepared soups, casseroles, salads and pantry treats, ice cream, bagels, bagel sandwiches, breads, pastries, tarts, pasta and sauces, coffee beverages and bags of beans, spreads, shakshuka, sweets, infused vinegars, refreshing beverages, hot tea, loose-leaf tea blends and spice blends, knife and tool sharpening services, seedlings, pancake mix, bars and granola, dog biscuits - the list goes on! Morningside Farmers_Market has been offering organically grown produce, local meats, breads, and goods since 1995. The market is open every Saturday morning year-round from 8:00-11:30am at Morningside Presbyterian Church's parking lot (1411 N. Morningside Drive NE). SNAP/EBT (food stamp) dollars are doubled for an equal amount of tokens for fruits and vegetables at the information tent. The market's location offers a spacious, tree-lined setting for market goers.
